**13. MONITORING REPORTS TO THE BOARD**

**13.1 Monthly Dashboard and Operations Report – April 2025**

Deputy Chief Landry presented the Board with the Monthly Dashboard and Operations Report outlining there were 2807 calls for service. Forty-one of which were Online reporting. Patrol Zone B in Innisfil was the busiest with 914 calls for service followed by Patrol Zone E in Bradford with 545 calls. The municipal divide was 56.12% for Innisfil and 43.88% for Bradford West Gwillimbury.

**Calls of Note:**

There were 23 ongoing active CAP investigations this month.

A homicide trial for a 2<sup>nd</sup> degree murder that took place in Bradford West Gwillimbury in September 2022, is currently in week 3 of a 6-week trial.

A vulnerable 33-year-old woman, who was last seen at the HUB in Bradford West Gwillimbury on April 19<sup>th</sup>, has been safely located and returned home to her father. CIB Officers were able to track her whereabouts and liaised with the OPP Huronia West detachment to coordinate her safe return.

There were 19 calls for service in the month of April regarding stolen vehicles, all these occurrences are still under investigation.

Street Crime Unit (SCU) are actively involved in multiple occurrences this month such as:

- A habitual property crime offender was arrested by the SCU after failing to attend court.
- Investigators recovered a firearm as part of an ongoing investigation.
- SCU identified a habitual retail thief as the suspect in a theft occurrence and was arrested.
- There were 14 canine calls for service.
- Several members are completing training.

Officers responded to ongoing traffic complaints regarding commercial motor vehicles and reduced load limits. Several locations and times were targeted with only one vehicle found to be over limit. Fifteen PON's were issued on scene, the trucks plates were seized along with the trailer. The trailer is under investigation as possibly being stolen.

Officers continue to target non-insured vehicles/drivers and remove these vehicles from the road with 30 Part III charges under the Compulsory Automobile Insurance Act this past month.

On the first day of using the Services newest instrument, the Intoxilyzer 9000, officers first stop with it resulted in an "Over 80" charge.

The Community Response Unit (CRU) were actively involved with the Bradford Leisure Centre and Library regarding ongoing complaints regarding students' fighting and disorderly conduct. CRU members conducted multiple patrols in the area during April, and the complaints and behaviours have reduced significantly through officer presence and education.

Throughout April Offender Management completed numerous compliance checks and made several arrests.

Apr. 5<sup>th</sup> – Officers from A-Platoon responded to a single motor vehicle MVC involving an e-bike on the Canal Road that resulted in impaired driving charges and an investigation into a male being wanted on a Canada Wide Immigration warrant.

Apr. 20<sup>th</sup> – A new recruit on B-Platoon showed great initiative and focus by issuing 20 Provincial Offence Notices (PON's) in a single shift under the guidance of her coach officer.

Apr. 24<sup>th</sup> – Police received multiple calls regarding a fight at the Tanger Outlet Mall between a group of youths. One of the youths had produced a gun and another was bleeding from the head. It is suspected that 3 youths assaulted a young male. The investigation continues.

May 23<sup>rd</sup> – Officers responded to the GTA Vaporium for a call regarding a male customer that had shown the employee a gun. The male expressed to the employee that he wanted to die and left the store. Officers located the suspect on Colborne St. south of the 8<sup>th</sup> line. He was arrested at gunpoint without incident.

### **14. CHIEF UPDATE**

Chief Van Dyke notified the Board that on April 24, 2025, Finance Manager Andrea Drover passed away. A donation to the Ontario SPCA was made in her honour.

Apr. 24 – Chief had his yearly meeting with Marie McCallum of Victim Services of Simcoe County. Also on this date, the Chief had his yearly check-in meeting with BWG CAO G. McKnight.

The SSPS was nominated to receive an award from Victim Services for our commitment to serving victims with compassion. Inspector Geoffroy and Staff Sergeant Irwin accepted on behalf of the Service on May 9<sup>th</sup>.

Apr. 25 – Chief had a goodbye lunch with retired Deputy Chief Sutton.

Apr. 26 – The Chief completed his thematic training. Note: the Deputy has completed his as well.

Apr. 28-29 – The Chief and Deputy Landry attended the Small and Mid-Sized Police Chief's meeting in Colbourg.

Apr. 30 – Deputy Chief Sutton's last day.

May 1 – Chief met with BWG By-Law in support of by-law officers who are being disrespected by citizens in the community. This will not be tolerated, and charges will be laid.

May 4 – Chief along with members of Command and the Service attended the Ontario Police Memorial at Queens Park in Toronto. Approximately 16 members attended.

May 6 – Chief and Deputy meet with the Association President and Vice President to keep the lines of communication open.

May 8 – Command completed their annual Use of Force and Firearms Training.

May 9 – The Chief along with members of COAST/CRU attended the Anti-Poverty Summit in Bradford West Gwillimbury.

May 10 – The Service held their annual Open Houses at both divisions. Very well attend. The Chief noted that next year they will revise the order so that Innisfil will take place in the afternoon and Bradford West Gwillimbury will be in the morning.

May 14 – Chief conducted an interview with B101/Barrie 360/Rock 95 for their podcast on the quarterly updates with Chief Van Dyke. The Deputy will be conducting the next interview in June.

May 16 – The Chief and Board Chair had their monthly meeting. Later that day, the Chief along with both Mayors attended Indian Consul General meet and greet in BWG. There was also the Lag Baomer Event with BWG, INN and Barrie Jewish communities at Centennial Park in Innisfil.

May 19 – The Chief attended the BWG Ward 6 BBQ which was hosted by Councillor Harper.

May 20 – Chief and Deputy attended a Command/Info Services Comm Centre Supervisor Meeting to provide opening remarks.

May 22 – The Chief conducted exit interviews with two members who left to go to another service.

May 27 – The official swearing-in ceremony for Deputy Chief Landry.

**Grants:**

Between Apr. 15 – May 7<sup>th</sup> – the Service completed 8-year end or final grant reports and wrote 3 new grant proposals. One of which is a joint grant proposal with Barrie Police Service.

Grants are a welcome source of funding, but also a major undertaking for the Service. This includes writing the grant proposal, implementing an approved grant, tracking the spending, and ensuring the proper data is collected to support completing interim and final reports. To better capture track grant reporting metrics, one of three coop students that have been brought on board will assist Dr. Semple. These coop students will also assist Dr. Semple with the Strategic Plan.

**On Going:**

An agreement on auto theft investigation and prevention with Equite Association has been signed.

The Chief has been meeting with staff that were unable to attend the awards ceremony in April to provide them with their award or service coins.

The updated Community Safety and Well-being Plan will be going to both councils for approval in June.

The Strategic Plan is underway. The board focus group will take place at the June meeting. Approximately one month behind.

The Deputy started a Modernization Working Group to look for efficiencies throughout the Service.

Financial reports should be caught up by the end of May for the June meeting.

Six new recruits will start on May 29<sup>th</sup>.

Completed processes – HR positions and coop students (U of T – unpaid)

On going processes – Redaction and Info Services, Communications and Special Constable.

Mayor Dollin added that the County of Simcoe is to pass a temporary no parking zone by-law on County Road 4 (Yonge street) at Sunset Speedway for Rib fest as they observed that last year people were parking too close to the entrance and causing sight line issues.

Mayor Dollin also wanted to let the Chief and Board Chair know that her office will be reaching out to arrange a meeting with AMO to review OPP billing being led by SOLGEN.

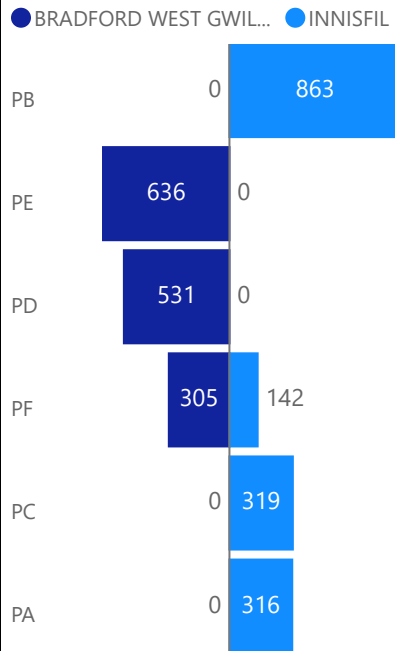

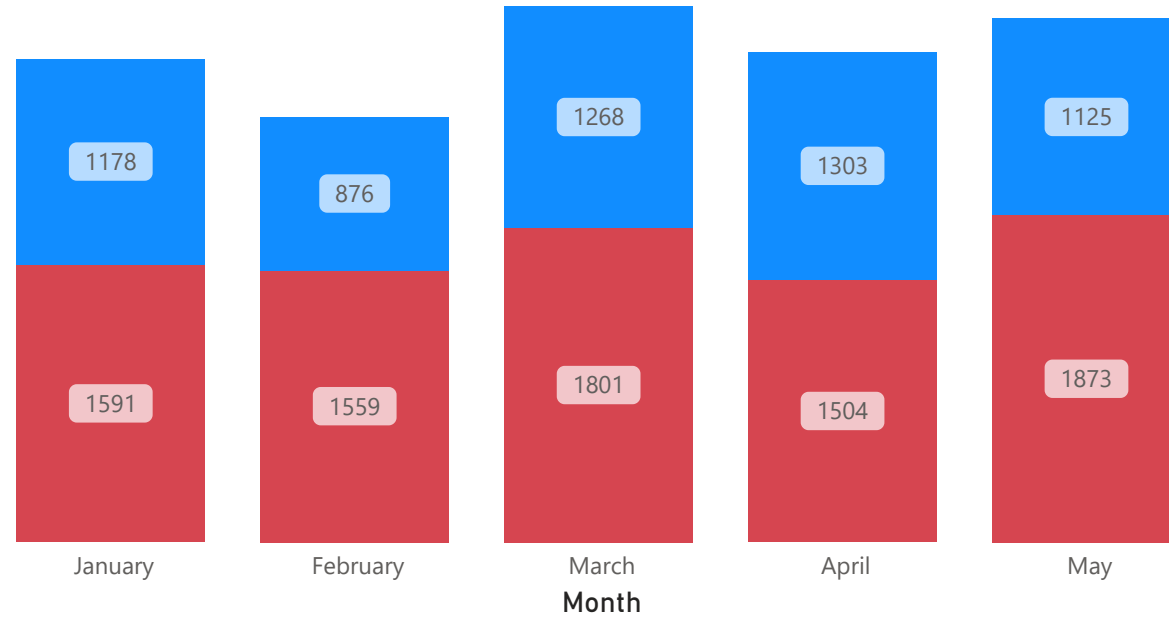

Patrol Zone & Municipality Divide



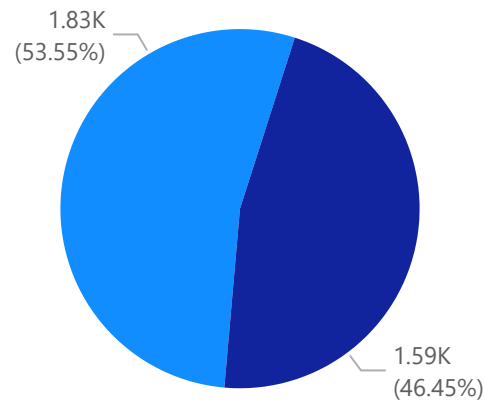
Proactive (blue) Vs. Reactive (red) Occurrences

# Fatal Motor Vehicle Collisions Dashboard



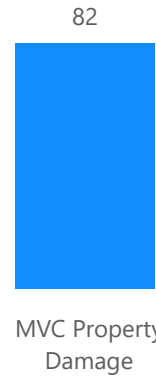

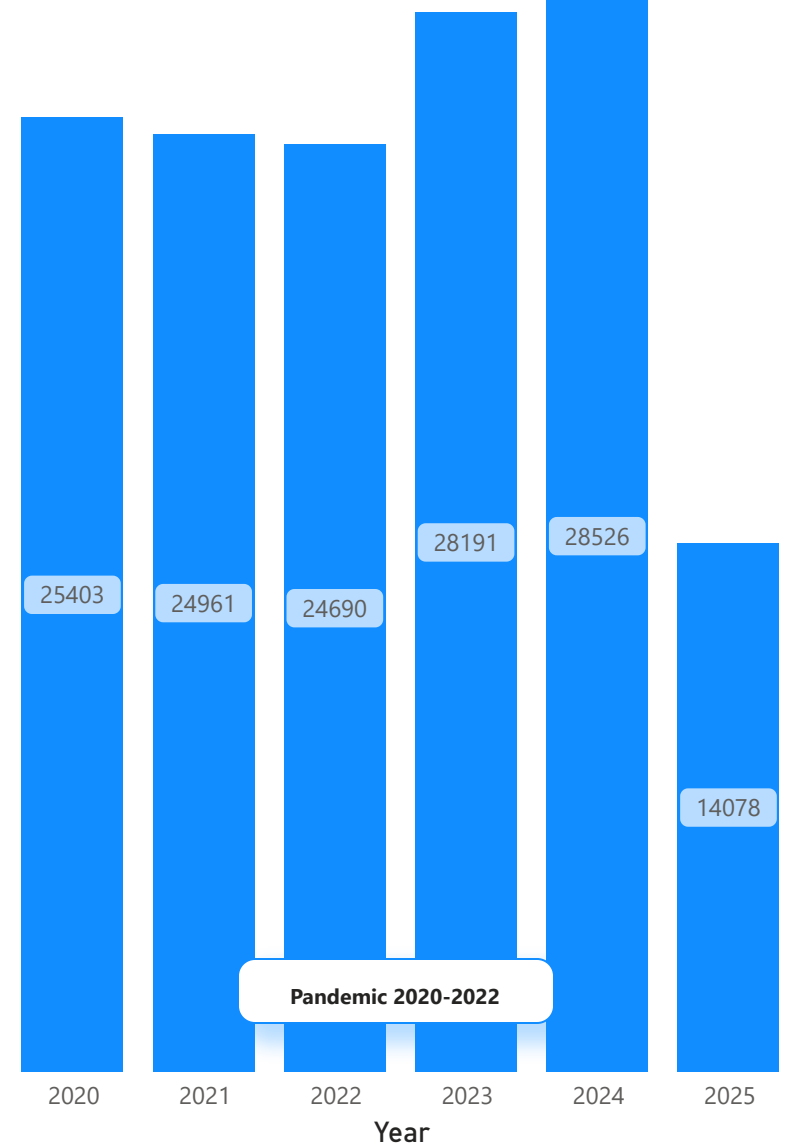
# Calls for Service Yearly Comparison Dashboard

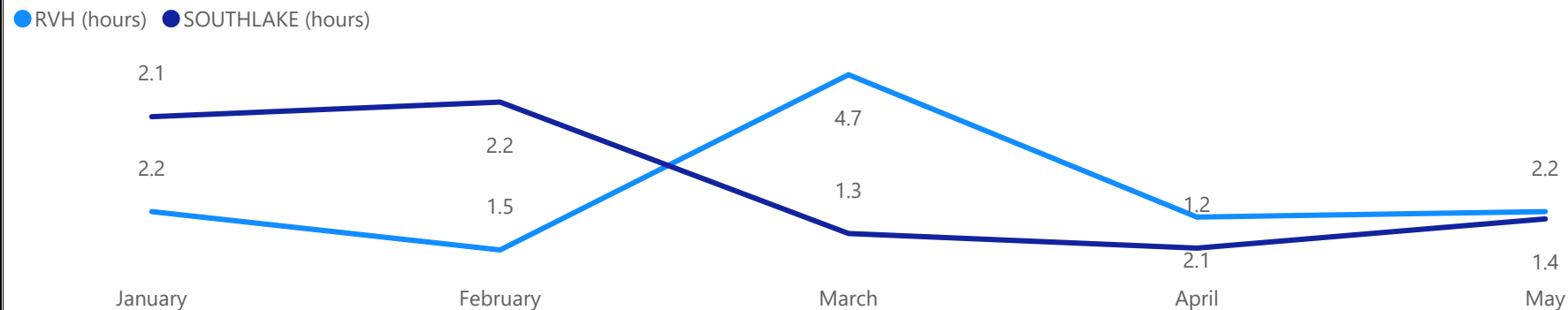




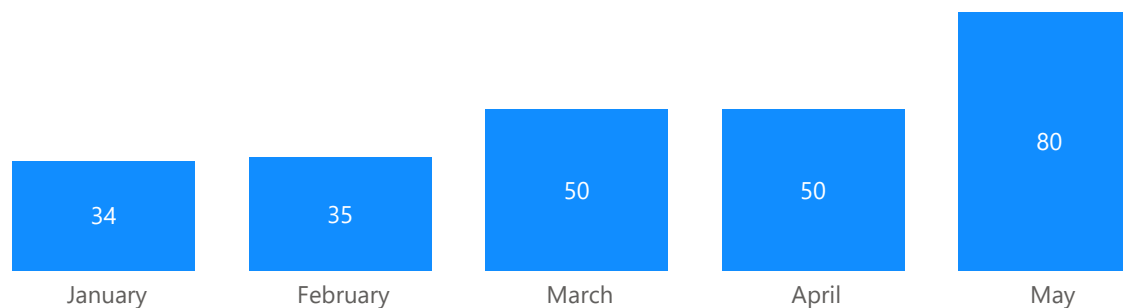

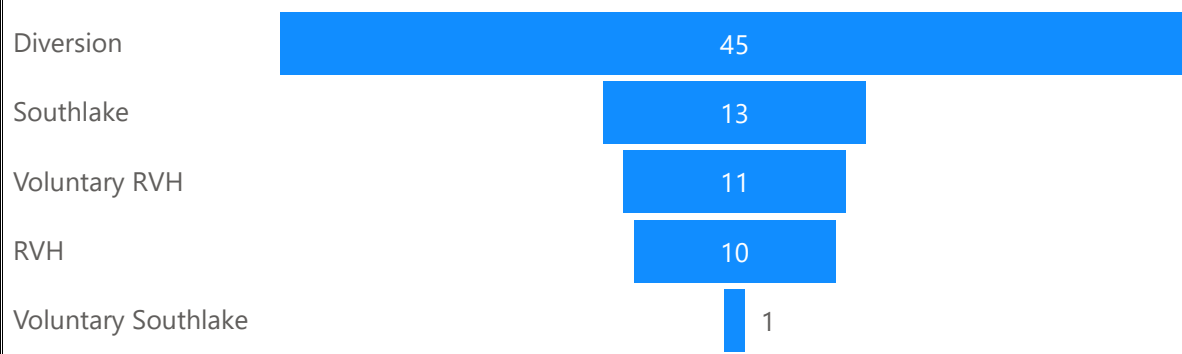

## Crimes Against Persons (CAP)

### 27 New Major Case Investigations May 2025

- **11 Sexual Assaults** (one (1) historic).
- **May 9, 2025 – Theft through Power of Attorney** 81-year-old victim. Innisfil Production Order being prepared to collect further evidence of the offence. Investigation remains ongoing.
- **May 9, 2025 – Parental Abduction** – Common-law spouse of the complainant has taken their biological child to Russia. Awaiting Attorney General consent to proceed with abduction charge. Investigation remains ongoing.
- **May 16, 2025 – Attempted Robbery** A group of three masked suspects attended a financial institution in the Town of Innisfil in a vehicle. The suspects waited in their vehicle for a period and then tried to enter the financial institution through the front door into a vestibule area. Employees at the financial institution were able to obtain the license plate of the suspect vehicle and then called 9-1-1. 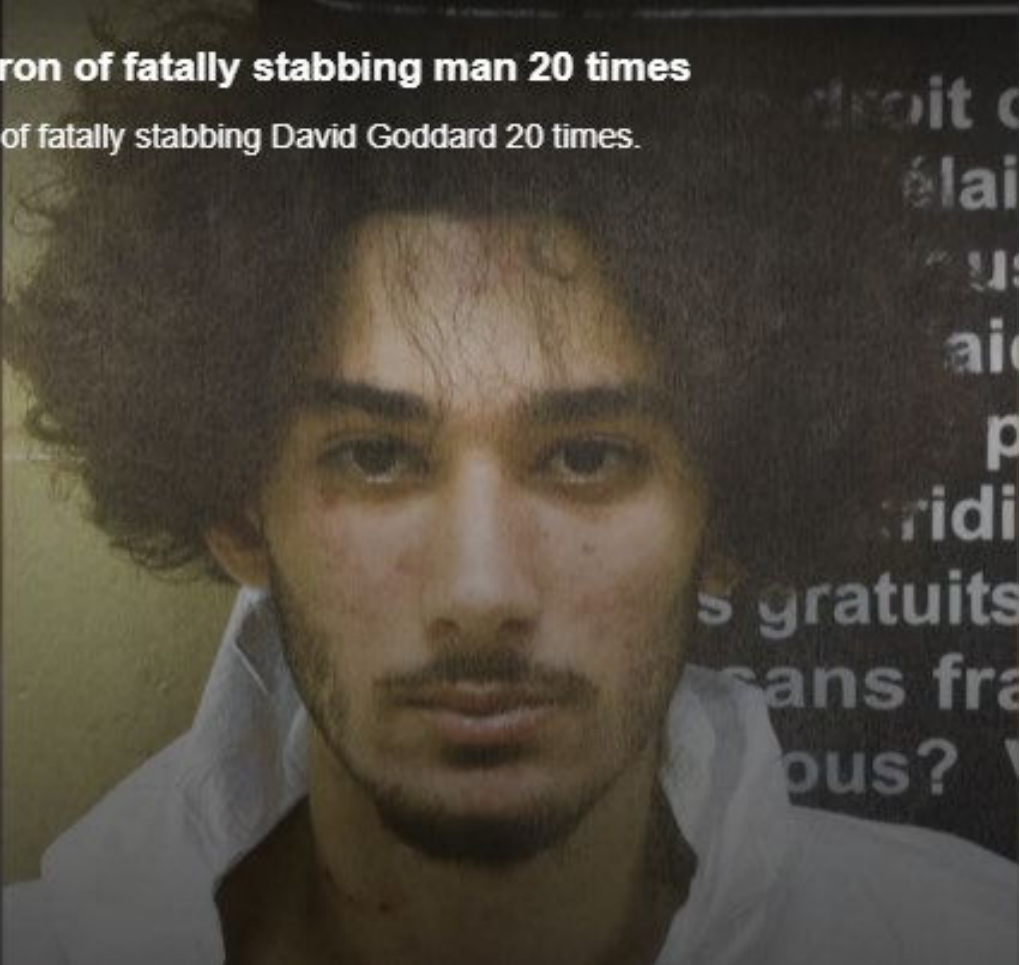

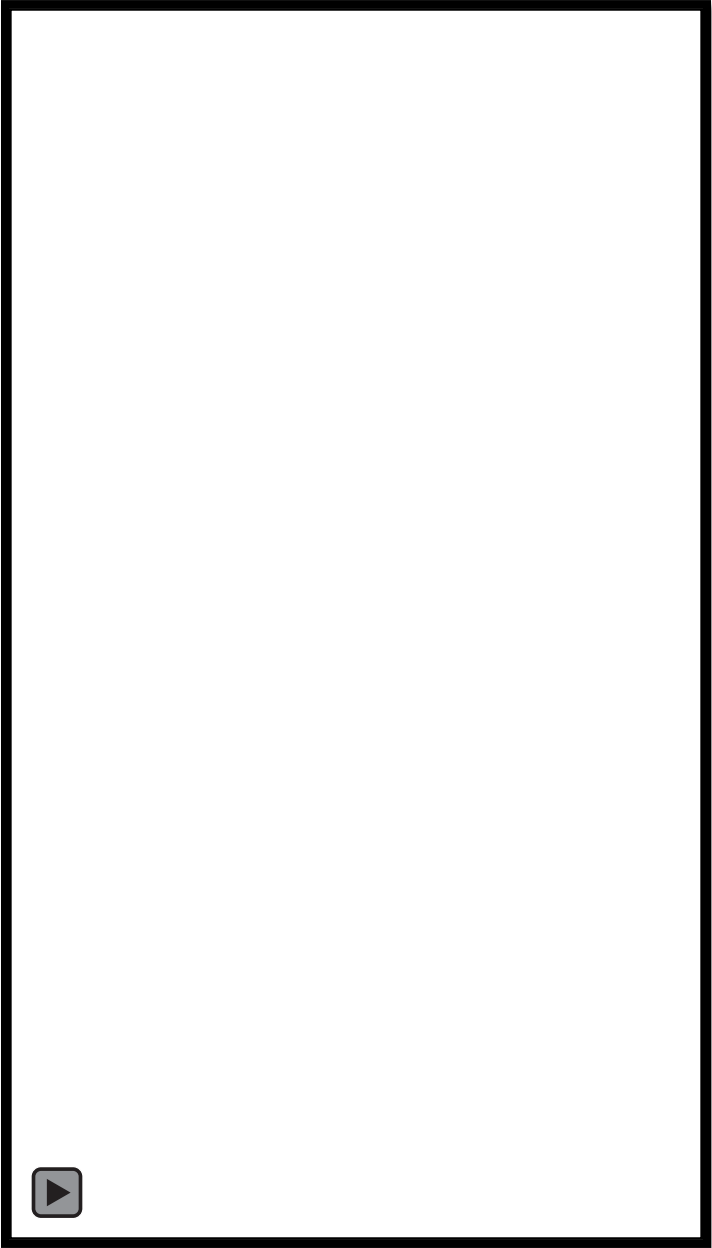
