## **CRIMINAL INVESTIGATIONS DEPARTMENT**

### **INVESTIGATIONS**

#### **Occurrence 2011-3576 – Breach of Probation**

On April 4, 2011 a female victim from Bradford received a call from her ex-husband, who was calling from a mental health institution. The male had been given a phone card by the institution and left alone to make unsupervised calls. He promptly called her and threatened to kill her. At the time of the offence, the male was on probation with a condition not to contact the victim. As a result, a detective attended the institution and charged the male with Uttering Threats and Breach of Probation.

#### **Occurrence 2011-3853 – Child Luring**

On April 11, 2011 police received a report that a 12 year old female from Bradford had been the victim of child luring via the internet. Investigation revealed the female met a male on a website and then communicated with him on MSN chat. This led to the victim posing nude for the male and performing other acts via a web cam. The male suspect has been traced to California. The assistance of the O.P.P. Project P has been sought to continue the investigation.

#### **Occurrence 2011-4143 – Domestic Assault**

On April 17, 2011 a detective received a call from a female who indicated she had been assaulted by her common law husband. Investigation revealed she had an altercation with her husband over a cell phone. During the argument the victim was assaulted repeatedly. The victim managed to call a family member to come to her aid. As a result, a 44 year old male from Innisfil was charged with Assault and Forcible Confinement. He was held for a bail hearing.

#### **Occurrence 2011-4720 – Obstruct Police/Personation**

The Street Crime Unit received information that a male, who had been arrested on April 9, 2011 by SSPS officers for Public Intoxication, had identified himself with a name belonging to another person. Detectives reviewed the cell video and confirmed that the male was someone else known to them. The person whose name was actually used was contacted and interviewed. On April 30<sup>th</sup> the suspect was located in a bar in Bradford and arrested. Investigation revealed the suspect had used a false name when he was arrested for being drunk because he was on bail conditions at the time. The suspect, a 22 year old Bradford male, was charged with a number of criminal offences including Personation, Fail to Comply x 3, Public Mischief and Obstructing a Police Officer. He was held for a bail hearing.

#### **Occurrence 2011-3975 – Sexual Assault**

On April 14, 2011 a 13 year old female victim attended the South Division to report that she was the victim of ongoing sexual abuse that started when she was 9-10 years old. Investigation revealed the victim's

stepfather had been molesting her at night for the past several years while her mother was at work. As a result, a 46 year old male from Bradford was arrested and charged with Sexual Assault x 2 and Sexual Interference x 2. He was held for a bail hearing.

#### **Occurrence 2011-4391 – Child Abuse**

On April 23, 2011 the Children's Aid Society contacted police to report a suspected case of child abuse. The victim, a 6 year old girl from Bradford, had been observed with several circular bruises on her forearm. Investigation revealed that the bruising occurred when the victim's mother had grabbed her by the arm while disciplining her. No charges were laid, but further follow-up with the family will be conducted by the CAS.

#### **Occurrence 2011-3708 – CDSA Offences**

After a lengthy investigation into a drug distribution cell operating in and around Bradford West Gwillimbury, Street Crime Members, along with members of the York Regional Police, were able to bring the investigation to a close. On April 7, 2011 the main target of the investigation was the subject of a traffic stop on Hwy #404 in York Region. The suspect refused to stop and fled from police. A police pursuit was initiated and the suspect was stopped after he struck a York Region cruiser. During the pursuit a large quantity of suspected cocaine was thrown out of the vehicle. The suspect was arrested and charged with a number of Controlled Drug & Substances Act and Criminal Code offences. He was held for a bail hearing. Search warrants were also executed at two Bradford addresses as well as two residences in York Region. One of the warrants in York Region uncovered more drugs. A 39 year old Newmarket male faces CDSA charges in relation to those warrants.

### **2011-4112      Liquor Licence Act Enforcement**

Over the past few months, uniformed officers have observed an increase in liquor related offences in the Bradford West Gwillimbury downtown area. Occurrences have included fights, assaults, mischief to property, mischief to vehicle and public intoxication offences.

On April 16<sup>th</sup>, officers from Uniform Patrol, Traffic & Marine, the Bicycle Patrol Unit and the Criminal Investigations Unit conducted an investigation in the downtown core area. As a result, officers issued three (3) Warn-Range Suspensions, six (6) Open Liquor charges, one (1) Controlled Drugs and Substance Act charge and made three (3) arrests for Public Intoxication.

### **2011-4160      Unsafe Storage of Firearms**

Uniformed officers were dispatched to an Alcona residence on April 17<sup>th</sup> in regards to a Domestic Dispute. A 46-year old Innisfil man was investigated by police and arrested for *Assault* on his wife and sister-in-law. A search of the residence following the arrest revealed that the man had four long guns stored under his bed in a careless manner. It was determined that the man was not licensed to possess any firearms. The man was held for a Bail Hearing facing ten charges, including *Assault*, *Careless Storage of a Firearm* and *Unauthorized Possession of a Firearm*. All the firearms were seized by responding officers.

### **2011-4440      Police Pursuit**

On April 24<sup>th</sup>, an officer was on general patrol in the Alcona area when he checked the licence plate of a vehicle that he was following on the Canadian Police Information Centre (CPIC). The check revealed that the vehicle had been reported stolen.

The officer attempted a traffic stop on the 20<sup>th</sup> Side Road, south of the 9<sup>th</sup> Line. The suspect vehicle pulled over. When the Constable approached the car, the driver suddenly accelerated away at a high rate of speed.

A suspect apprehension pursuit was initiated by police and continued for a short distance on the 9<sup>th</sup> line. As the suspect vehicle approached the 400 Industrial area, a Patrol Sergeant terminated the pursuit in the interest of public safety.

Approximately one hour later, officers from Barrie Police located the suspect hiding in his vehicle at a hotel. The suspect was arrested without incident and turned over to South Simcoe Police. A 22-year old Innisfil man was held for a Bail Hearing facing several charges under the Criminal Code and Highway Traffic Act.

**2011-4686 Liquor Licence Act Enforcement**

On April 29<sup>th</sup>, officers from Uniform Patrol, Traffic & Marine, the Bicycle Patrol Unit and the Criminal Investigations Unit conducted an investigation in the downtown core area of Bradford West Gwillimbury. As a result, officers arrested two (2) *Impaired Drivers*, arrested two (2) other people for *Possession of a Controlled Substance* and issued six (6) *Open Liquor charges*.

One licensed premise was charged with several offences including *Selling Alcohol to a Minor, Failing to Check Identification* and *Employing Unlicensed Security Guards*. A second bar was charged with *Permitting Drunkenness* and *Being Over capacity*. A third licensed premise was charged with *Being an Unregistered Business* and *Employing Unlicensed Security Guards*.

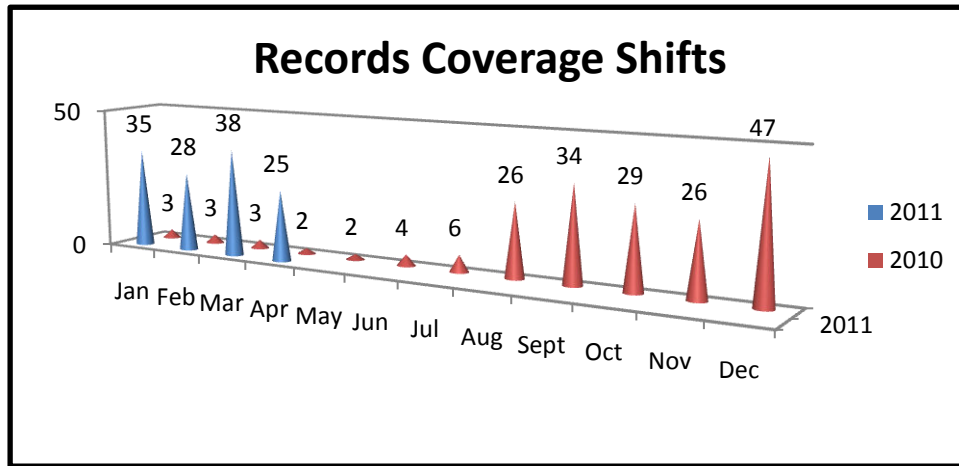

## RECORDS DEPARTMENT

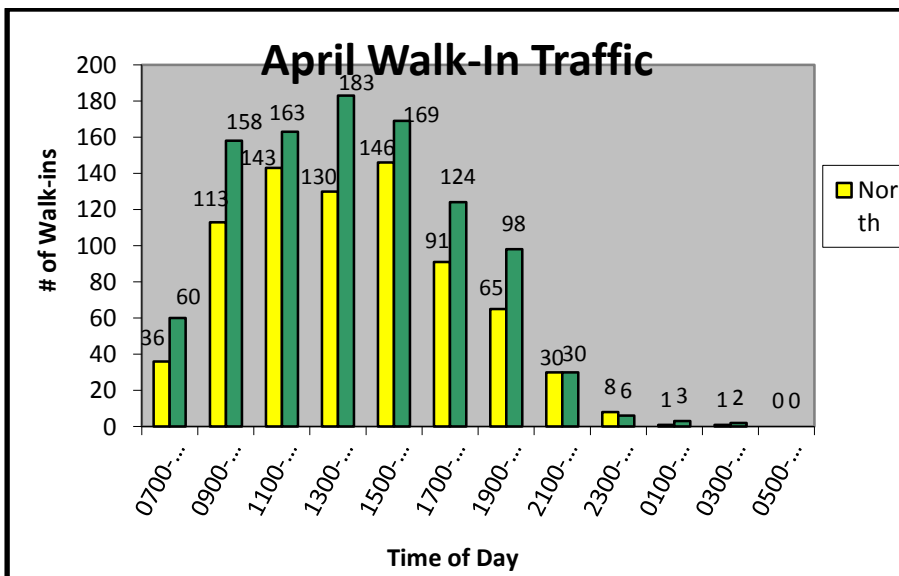
### Staffing

### Front Counter Walk-Ins

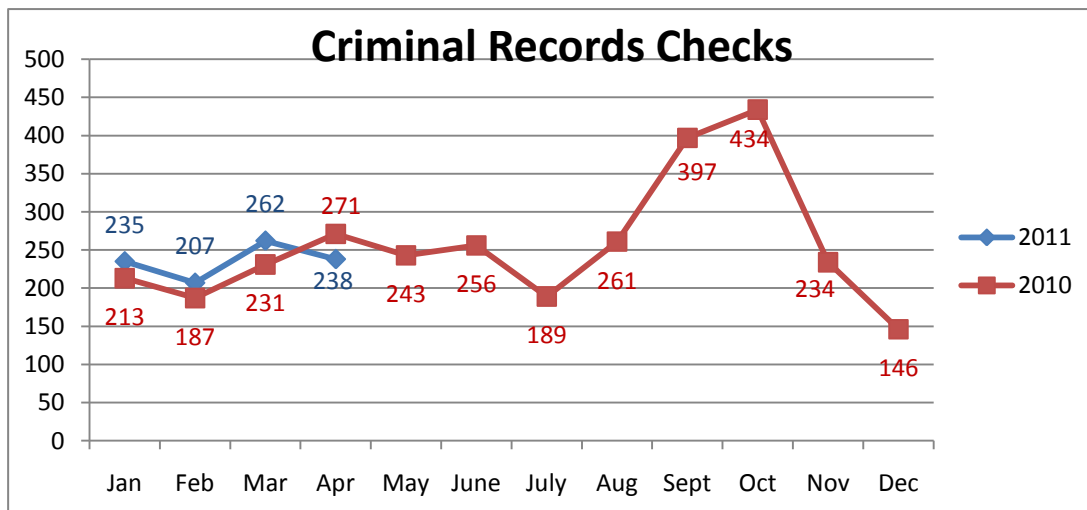
An assessment of Front Counter walk in traffic was completed at both the North and South Divisions for the month of April. The results of the walk-in tallies are shown in the graph below.



**Criminal Record Checks**

Records staff continue to work through CRC Applications and the corresponding paperwork. A total of 238 Criminal Records Checks were processed in the month of April.

The LEARN (Law Enforcement and Records Networking) sub-committee’s Police Record Checks Guidelines document was approved by the OACP this month. Training on the new guidelines will be conducted mid-May and early June at the Peel Regional Police training center. Two members of the Service have been registered to attend this training.



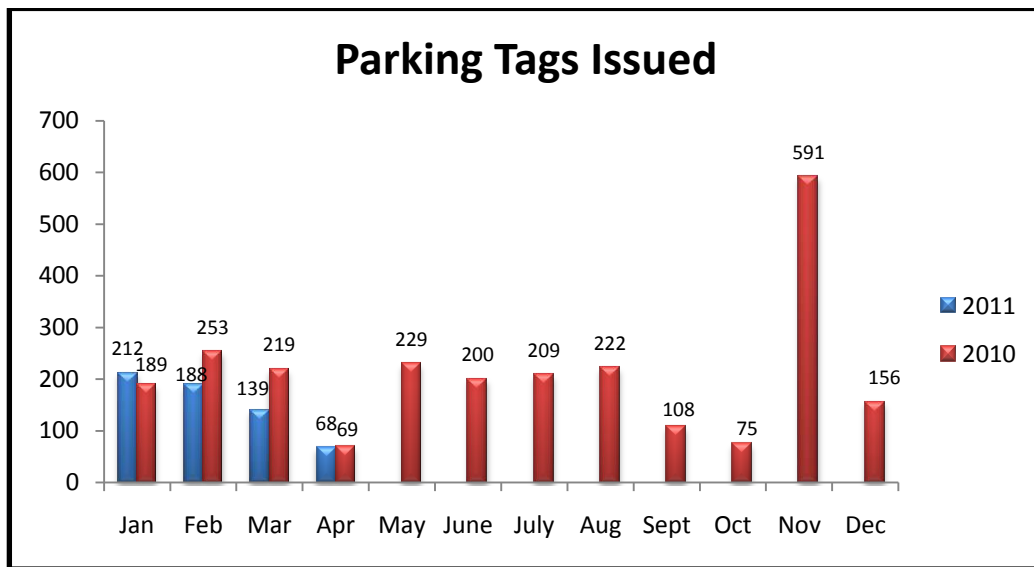
**Statistics Canada**

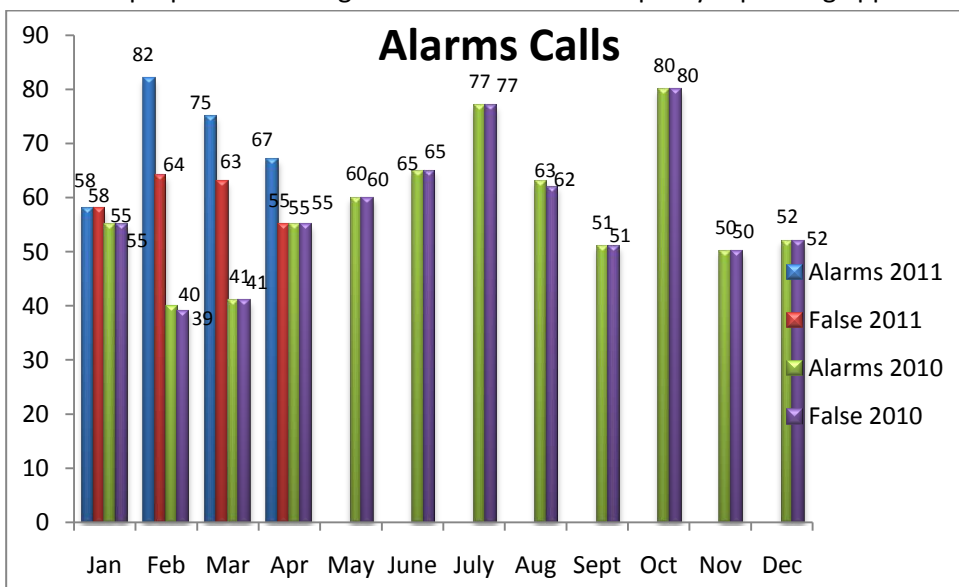
Parking Tags

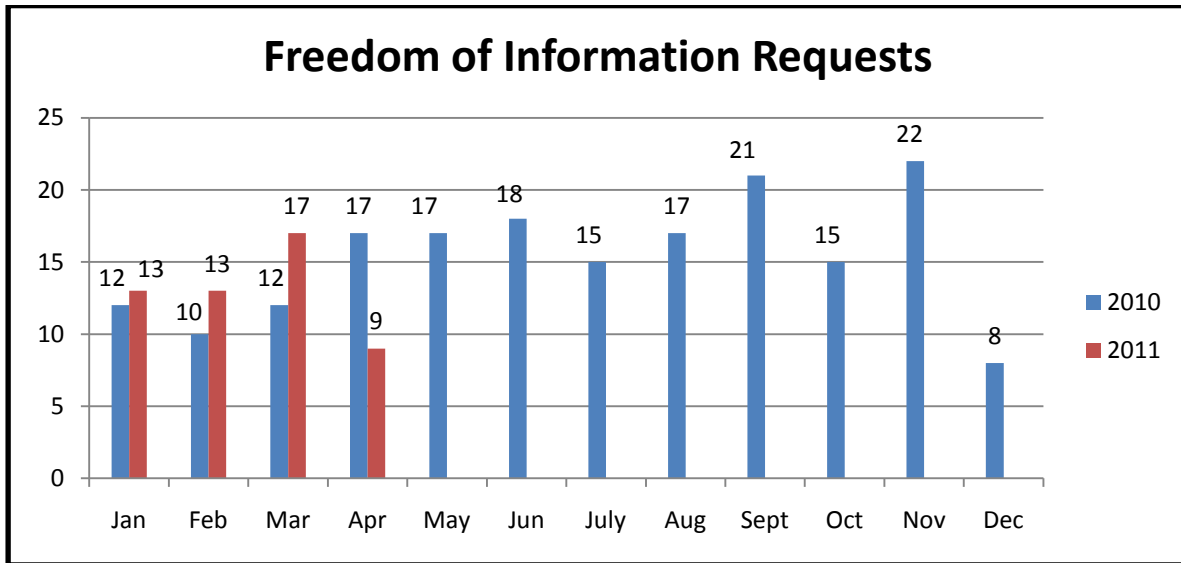


Alarms
