**12.4 Tire Storage – Capital Funds Reallocation Request – Chief**

The Town of Innisfil can no longer store the Services tires due to space constraints. The Chief is requesting that funds be reallocated in order to purchase storage containers to house them.

Mayor Leduc would like the Chief to explore if these funds can come from the Town’s DC’s as this is due to the growth of both municipalities. The Chief will have this report forwarded to the municipal finance teams to explore this possibility.

Member Singh inquired as to where these containers will be stored and if they will need to pay an additional fee for the storage space. As per the Chief, no they have not asked for any additional fees to store them. They will be stored at InnPower.

**13. MONITORING REPORTS TO THE BOARD**

**13.1 February 2026 Operations Dashboard and Report – Deputy Landry**

Deputy Chief Landry reviewed his report with Board Members outlining there were:

CAP - 14 new criminal investigations,

SCU - 8 new investigations and 3 ongoing.

Platoon A – 161 charges laid (140 provincial & 21 criminal)

Platoon B – 300 charges laid (259 provincial & 41 criminal)

Platoon C – 115 charges laid (97 provincial & 18 criminal)

Platoon D – 136 charges laid (100 provincial & 36 criminal)

Traffic & Marine – 2 Criminal Code, 63 Part III, 33 No Insurance and 16 Drive Under Suspension

CRU – 5 Notable interactions, 76 compliance checks, 28 community events and 5 PON’s from proactive patrols

MCRT – 22 calls attended, 52 number of referrals and follow ups and 9.0 estimated time spent at the hospital.

Community Activity – 28 community events, 38 hours spent at community event and 9.0 average time spent per activity.

Offender Management – 75 compliance checks, 4 warrant checks and 81.0 hours spent on Offender Management.

Canine – 14 deployments

Provincial Auto theft – 19 occurrences, 1 arrest and 1 expert vehicle examination.

Ident – 103 requests and 86 completed

Financial Crimes – 19 ongoing investigations

Feb. 12<sup>th</sup> was the Services launch of the new website. Since then, there have been 33,000 visits. Top interests are careers and job postings, reports and records checks, media reports, road safety and bus cancellations.

The Operations Dashboard showed 3,199 occurrences for the month of February with 19 of those being reported online. Forty-six (46%) percent were Bradford and 51% in Innisfil.

Mayor Dollin commented about the home invasions, that the perception from the community is that houses are randomly chosen and people barge in. Is this correct? As per the Deputy and the Chief, typically these are targeted incidents. A media release will go out if there is no threat to the communities.

Mayor Dollin asked if we are in line with other Services when it comes to online reporting. As per Inspector Fernandes, yes, they are.

Mayor Dollin also asked what ‘compassionate to locate’ means. As per the Deputy, missing persons.

Mayor Leduc asked the Deputy to put together stats for January to March for the 9<sup>th</sup> and all intersections from the 27<sup>th</sup> over to Yonge St., as they have had major collisions there and the Mayor would like to address this with the County.

**13.2 February 2026 Finance Reports – Chief Van Dyke**

There are no financial reports for the month of February due to year end audit.

A. February 2026 Capital Report Update

Chief Van Dyke reviewed the February 2026 Capital Report with Board Members outlining that as of year-to-date, they have spent \$440,966 of the \$1.9 million requested. The majority of that was on vehicles and upfitting. They have purchased all vehicles for the year, plus ordering ones that will be to replace.

They have completed the connected officer program and purchased and deployed cell phones to the frontline officers, traffic, and crew.

Mayor Dollin asked if the Service has a policy regarding the cell phones. As per Chief Van Dyke, yes there is a policy in place.

B. February 2026 Operating Budget Summary

The summary for financial activities shows they are in an overall positive variance for the month of February in the amount of \$360,814.

**13.3 Missing Persons Report – Inspector Fernandes**

Inspector Fernandes reviewed the Missing Persons Report with Board Members outing that during the period of January 1st to December 31st, 2025, South Simcoe Police used the urgent demands provisions of the Missing Persons Act on four separate occurrences.

The urgent demand provision was used to obtain records of telecommunications or records that contain other electronic communications information, including information signals related to that person's location. It's also used to obtain records of financial information, specifically in these instances, cell phone records and details were sought in addition to banking activity. The missing persons were three males and one female, all of which were located by using the provisions of the Act.

**14. CHIEF UPDATE – January & February 2026**

Jan. 29<sup>th</sup> – Chief and Deputy were interviewed by Rock95/Cool FM in regard to 2026 updates and plans.

Jan. 30<sup>th</sup> – MCRT Funding announcement was made at the North Div. It was attended by three Ministers of the Crown; Kerzner, Mulroney and Khanjan, as well as several media outlets.

SSPS will be cohosting with Barrie Police a Small and Mid-sized Chief's conference in April. There will be no cost to the Board. It is a cost recovery event as well as through sponsorships.

Feb. 5<sup>th</sup> – Chief and Deputy attended an Auxiliary Meeting.

Chief along with the Board Chair, Vice Chair and Member Singh have been attending on going bargaining sessions over the last couple of months.

Feb. 6<sup>th</sup> – Chief meet with Deputy Mayor Sandhu who is planning some voluntary cultural competence sessions at the Sikh Temple in Bradford for the spring.

Feb. 10<sup>th</sup> – Chief attended a lunch and learn session in regard to AI Call Management software for Comm Centers. ESCO partners, Guelph and Brantford are in the process of piloting two different product projects.

Feb. 12<sup>th</sup> – Launch of the new SSPS website. Thank you to Samah for all her hard work that went into this.

Feb. 13<sup>th</sup> – Chief had another Rock95/Kool FM interview on police corruption and what they have in place, and what they are planning to do going forward.

Feb. 17<sup>th</sup> - Meetings started to pre-plan for enhanced employee screening and vetting evidence and property management pillars for the future IOP independent inspection.

Chief was on vacation the last week of February.

Feb. 28<sup>th</sup> – Coldest Night of the Year event took place. The Service had a team in both BWG and Innisfil. The Chief attended the BWG one while other members attended the Innisfil event.

Mar. 2<sup>nd</sup> – Chief, Deputy and Inspector Fernandes attended IRD training at the InnPower Building in support of the Training Branch.

Mar. 6<sup>th</sup> – Chief met with the IT Dept. to review the database and network security system.

Mar. 12 – Polar Plunge event took place at the YRP Association Building in support Special Olympics. SSPS had two teams fundraising for it.

Mar. 13<sup>th</sup> – A headset presentation took place for four new part-time communicators. This is a presentation similar to when an officer receives their badge once they have completed all the required training.

Mar. 20<sup>th</sup> – S/Sgt. Willan attended a festival in BWG on behalf of the Chief as he had a prior commitment.

- 4 communicators have been hired and are completing their training.
- 2 part-time constables have been hired and are completing their training. They will be deployed operationally next week.
- 13 Auxiliary candidates currently in background checks.
- 4 cadets in training and 1 cadet have been hired.

- Strategic Plan is now complete. Thank you to Dr. Semple and staff for all their hard work.
- 2025 Annual Report is almost complete and will be available for the April Board Meeting.
- They continue to work on the conflict-of-interest IOP inspection preplanning work to get ahead of the inspection.
- Multi-factor authentication for all members is in progress. All members with company cell phones will have to ensure that they have their multi factor done by the end of the month.
- Spring open houses are scheduled for Police Week.

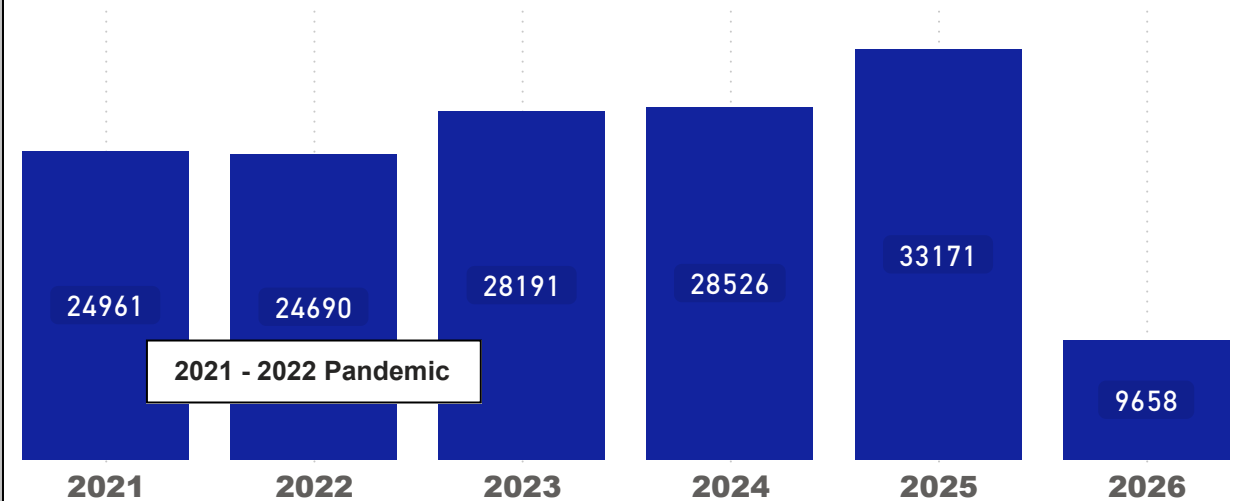

# Police bust retail theft ring targeting Home Depot stores, including in Barrie

March 30, 2026 | Month's long investigation into organized retail thefts at several Home Depot stores in Ontario

- Following a months-long investigation, **two 22-year-old men have been charged** in connection with organized retail thefts at multiple Home Depot stores across Ontario.
- The incidents occurred between November 2025 and February 2026 **in Barrie, Bradford, Orillia, and Markham.**
- The accused used **self-checkout manipulation** and **fraudulent returns** to avoid full payment.

# Driver flees police from Bradford plaza, vehicle found in York Region

**March 14, 2026 | Approx 2:00 PM | Holland Street West, Bradford West Gwillimbury**

- B Platoon officers identified a grey Nissan Altima at a plaza on Holland Street West exhibiting aggressive driving, including tire spinning and drifting in a commercial plaza.
- Officers investigated the vehicle, in relation to **careless driving, licence plate misuse, and occupant safety concerns**. The driver was accompanied by a **female passenger** and a **young child**
- Soon after the **driver sped out of the plaza, mounted a curb and drove on the sidewalk**. Officers terminated following the vehicle due to public safety.
- The vehicle was later recovered in Vaughan near Cityview Drive and Highway 400 and a search warrant obtained to examine the contents.

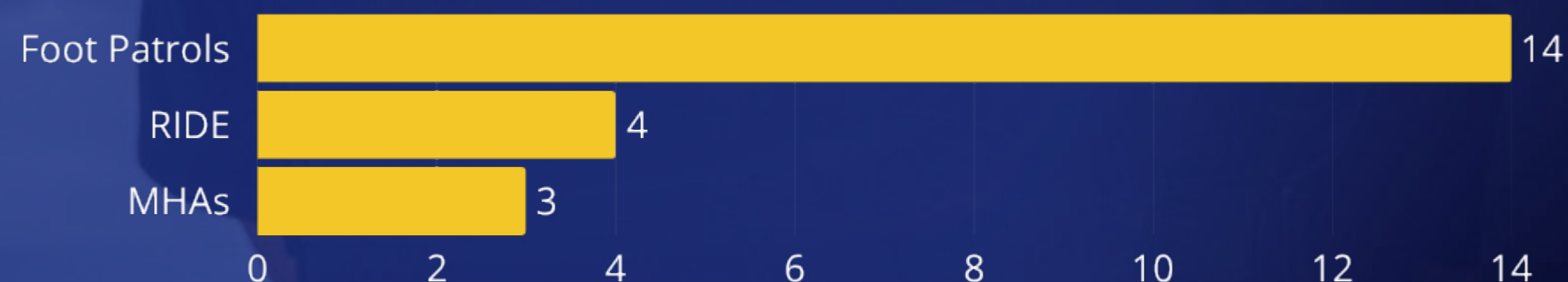

# Man charged with careless driving, open liquor after blowing stop signs

March 2, 2026 | 3:45 AM | Area of Stevenson Crescent, Bradford West Gwillimbury

- Officers observed a vehicle parked with its engine running.
- As police approached, the driver fled at a high rate of speed, driving erratically, failing to stop for two posted stop signs.
- The vehicle was later located at a residence on Colborne Street.
  - An open container of alcohol was found inside the vehicle.
  - The driver was arrested without incident.
- A 28-year-old Bradford man has been charged with careless driving, failing to stop at stop signs, open liquor in a motor vehicle, and failing to surrender required documents.

# Stolen U-Haul leads to arrest in Bond Head, seized drugs, stolen items

**Three** separate incidents in Innisfil on March 5 resulted in **multiple charges**.

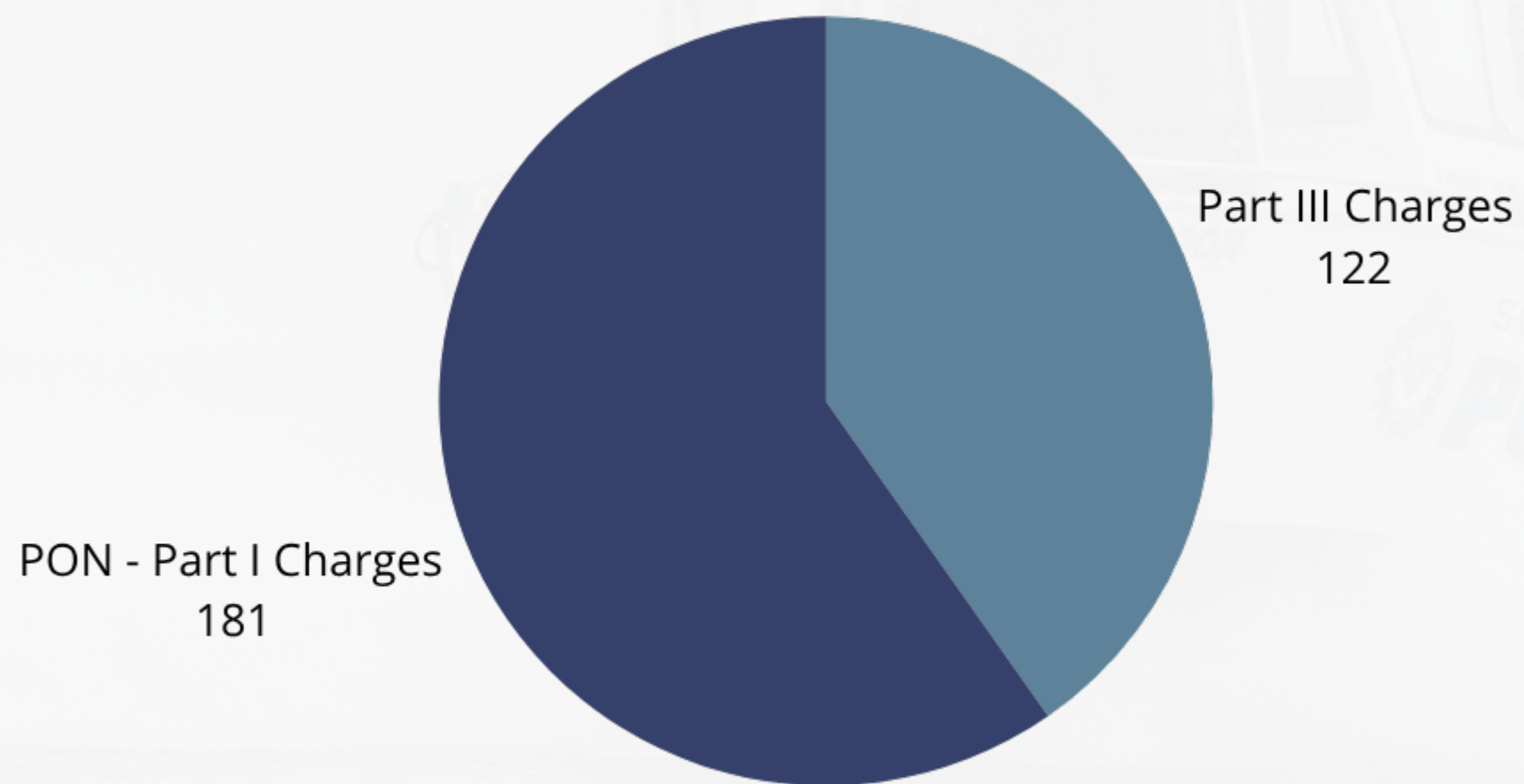

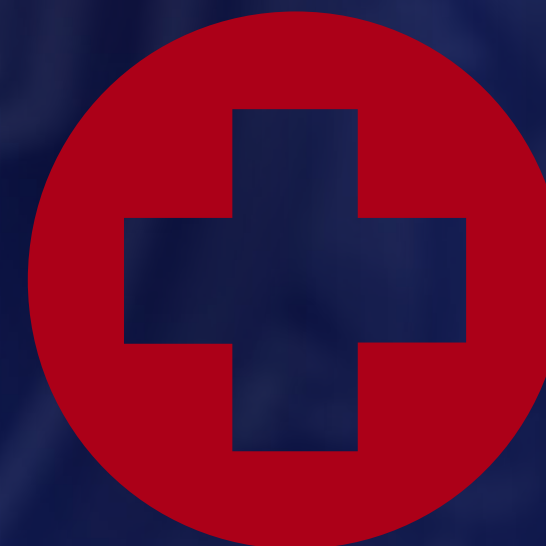

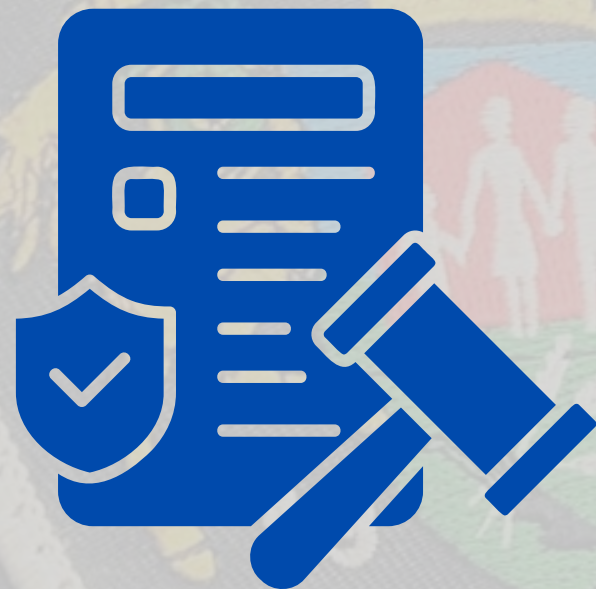
- Police responded to a disturbance at an apartment complex on Innisfil Beach Road at approximately 7:20 p.m. on March 9.
