THREE SUSPECTS, ONE ARMED WITH A HANDGUN, BREAK INTO INNISFIL HOME: POLICE

April 4, 2026 | Approx 5:00AM | Orchard Avenue, Innisfil

- Police responded to a home invasion in Innisfil involving **three masked suspects**, one of whom was believed to be **armed with a handgun**.
- During the incident, a **firearm was discharged** after the suspects were confronted by the homeowner. No injuries were reported.
- The suspects **fled the area in a white Honda sedan** prior to police arrival.
- Investigators obtained video footage from the residence and continue to investigate the incident.

SUICIDAL MALE INVESTIGATION RESULTING IN ARREST AND CANNABIS SEIZURE

April 24, 2026 | 1:40PM - 3:26PM | Sandy Cove, Innisfil

- Our officers assisted the Barrie Police Service with locating and apprehending a suicidal male in Innisfil believed to be in possession of a firearm.
- Members established a perimeter and safely apprehended the male. **Grounds existed for failure to comply with judicial release and non-communication conditions** under the **Criminal Code** of Canada.
- Members **conducted a Section 117 safety search** of the residence due to concerns the firearm may be used on police in an attempt to engage in self-harm.
- During the search, officers located and seized approximately **29 lbs of dried cannabis** packaged in one-pound quantities as **evidence of Possession for the Purpose of Trafficking**.

VEHICLE CLOCKED AT 140 KM/H IN 80-ZONE IN BRADFORD WEST GWILLIMBURY, POLICE CHARGE BRAMPTON MAN

March 31, 2026 | 10:48AM | County Road 27, Bradford West Gwillimbury

- Officers charged a **27-year-old Brampton man** with **speeding** and **stunt driving** after allegedly travelling **140 km/h in an 80 km/h zone** on County Road 27 in Bradford West Gwillimbury.
- The driver's vehicle was **impounded for 14 days** and his driver's **licence was suspended for 30 days.**
- Police reported the driver was relocating the vehicle between dealerships at the time of the offence.





REPEAT STOP LEADS TO MULTIPLE CHARGES, PLATE SEIZURE, AND TOW

April 15, 2026 | 6:50AM | County Road 88, Bradford West Gwillimbury

- During proactive patrol in BWG, officers stopped a vehicle **operating with an expired permit and determined the vehicle was uninsured**. The male driver, a G1 licence holder, was also found to be driving unaccompanied on a prohibited 400-series highway.
- Later the same morning, officers **observed the same vehicle operating in Innisfil** still displaying the expired permit and without insurance. **Police seized the licence plates and had the vehicle towed**.
- A **36-year-old male and 40-year-old female, both from Barrie**, were charged with:
 - **Drive motor vehicle – no currently validated permit**
 - **Operate motor vehicle without insurance**
 - **Fail to surrender permit for motor vehicle**
 - **G1 licence holder – unaccompanied by qualified driver**
 - **G1 licence holder – driving on a prohibited highway**
 - **Permit operation of a motor vehicle without insurance**





FRAUDULENT LICENCE PLATES DISCOVERED DURING TRAFFIC STOP STOP SAME DRIVER - MULTIPLE CHARGES LAID AND SEVERAL INCIDENTS LINKED

April 15, 2026 | 2:00PM | Bridge Street, Bradford West Gwillimbury

- During proactive patrol in BWG, officers conducted a traffic stop after observing a vehicle displaying a licence plate violation and tinted plate cover. Police determined the **vehicle was uninsured and the driver was operating without a valid licence.**
- Further investigation revealed the **licence plates were fraudulent replicas linked to a 2025 fail-to-remain collision in Durham Region** and unpaid offence notices in Bradford. Officers later observed the accused operating the vehicle again using plates removed from another vehicle.
- On April 16, 2026, officers arrested a **42-year-old male from Beaverton** and charged him with:
 - **Utter Forged Document**
 - **Identity Fraud**
 - **Fraud Under \$5,000**
 - **Operate motor vehicle without insurance**
 - **Drive no licence**
 - **Use plate not authorized for vehicle**
 - **Drive motor vehicle with no validated permit**





TWO DRIVERS HOSPITALIZED AFTER WEST-END BRADFORD CRASH: POLICE

April 20, 2026 | 12:40PM | Line 9 and County Road 27, Bradford West Gwillimbury

- Officers responded to a **two-vehicle collision** at the intersection of Line 9 and County Road 27 in Bradford West Gwillimbury.
- **One driver sustained minor injuries** and both drivers were transported to hospital as a precaution.
- The investigation remains **ongoing**.

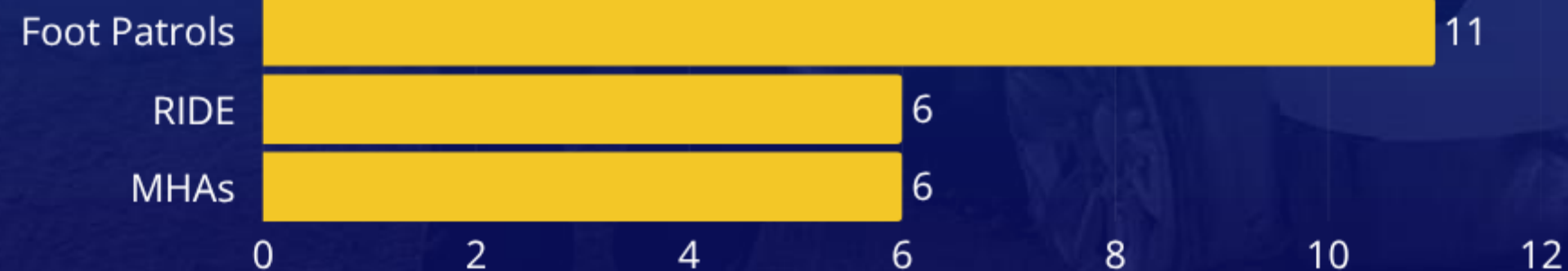

POLICE CHARGE MAN AFTER VANDALISM AT ISLAMIC CENTRE IN INNISFIL

April 10, 2026 | 3:45PM | Baitul Badi Islamic Centre, Innisfil

- Officers responded to a report of **vandalism** at the Islamic Centre of Innisfil after a suspect attended the property and **used spray paint to damage the building.**
- Police obtained video footage from the surrounding area and appealed to the public for assistance identifying the suspect and involved vehicle.
- Through the investigation, police identified and charged a **66-year-old male from Innisfil** with:
 - **Mischief to Religious Property – Not Exceeding \$5,000** contrary to the Criminal Code of Canada





FOUR PEOPLE DETAINED IN BRADFORD GUN CALL SUNDAY NIGHT, POLICE SAY

April 19, 2026 | 9:30PM | Bradford West Gwillimbury

- Officers responded to a **weapons complaint** in Bradford West Gwillimbury after a concerned resident reported observing **several individuals carrying what appeared to be short-barrelled rifles.**
- Police located the involved vehicle near Carter Street and Miller Park Avenue and conducted an investigation.
- Through the investigation, **officers determined the suspected firearms were air rifles** and not authentic firearms.
- The **individuals cooperated with police and were released** without charges.

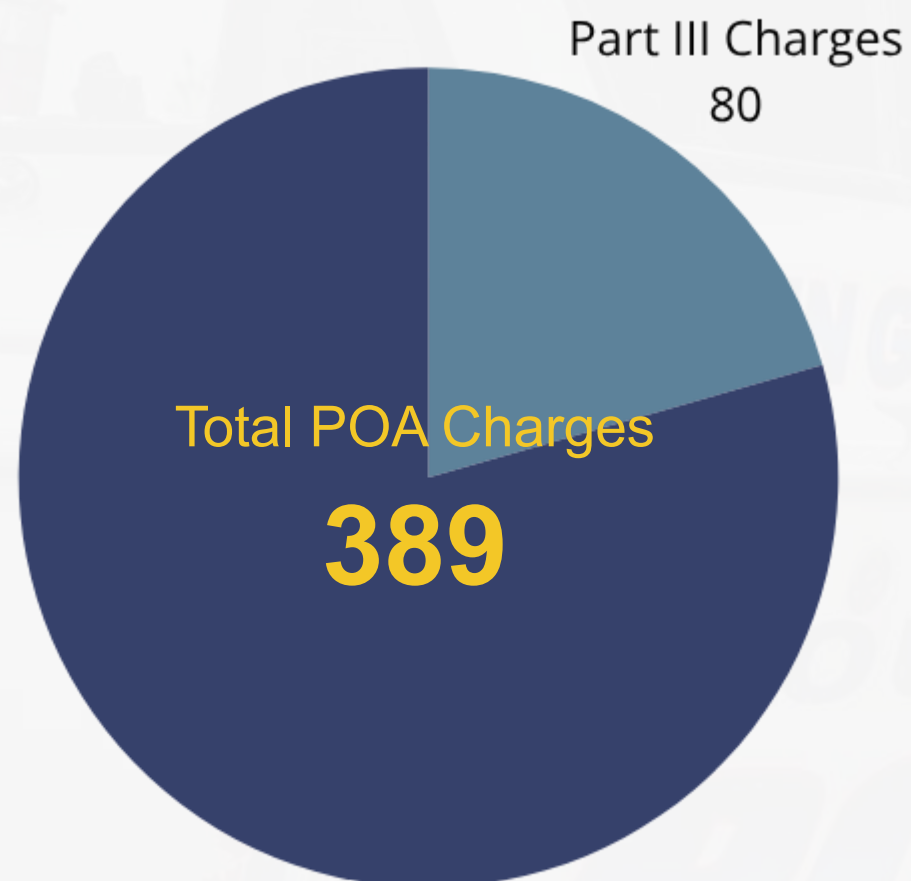

April 7, 2026 | Bradford West Gwillimbury

- Officers investigated incidents involving the targeted **harassment and assault of a vulnerable community member** in Bradford West Gwillimbury.
- Police reported the **victim was led to a secluded area**, where they were **subjected to repeated acts of violence** while the incident was recorded and shared online.
- As a result of the investigation, a **14-year-old youth** from York Region turned themselves in to police and was **charged with multiple counts of assault** under the Criminal Code of Canada.

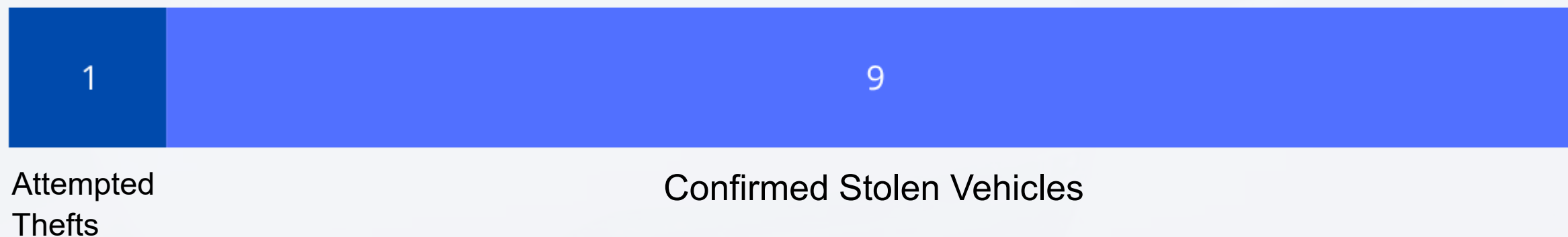

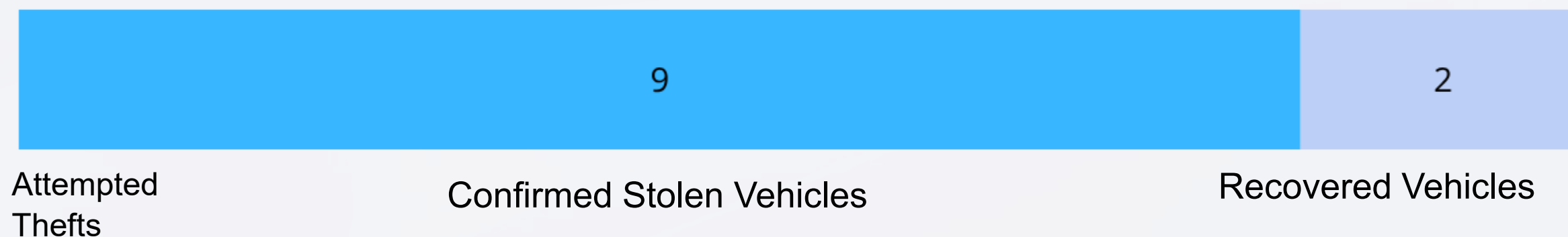

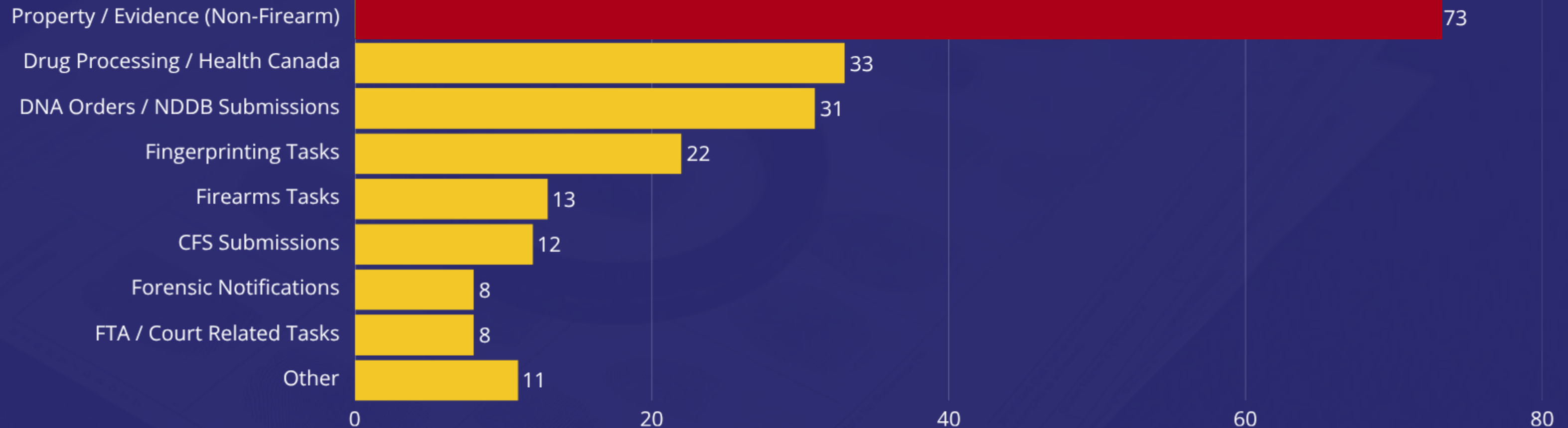
