# Barrie man charged after Innisfil variety store robbed at knifepoint

January 13, 2026 | 6:45PM | Sandy Cove Variety (Lockhart Rd., Innisfil)

- K9 Nash deployed; suspect tracked to a nearby residence and arrested.
- As a result, a **46 year -old man from Barrie** has been charged with:
  - Robbery with a weapon
  - Disguise with intent
  - Assault with a weapon
  - Possession of a weapon for a dangerous purpose
  - Possession of property obtained by crime under \$5,000



Police believe this knife was brandished during a robbery at a variety store in Innisfil.





# Bradford Walmart Assault - Suspects ID'd, Arrested, and Charged

- Two suspects forced open checkout gates during a theft attempt and sprayed a loss-prevention officer with an unknown substance.

- Assault causing bodily harm

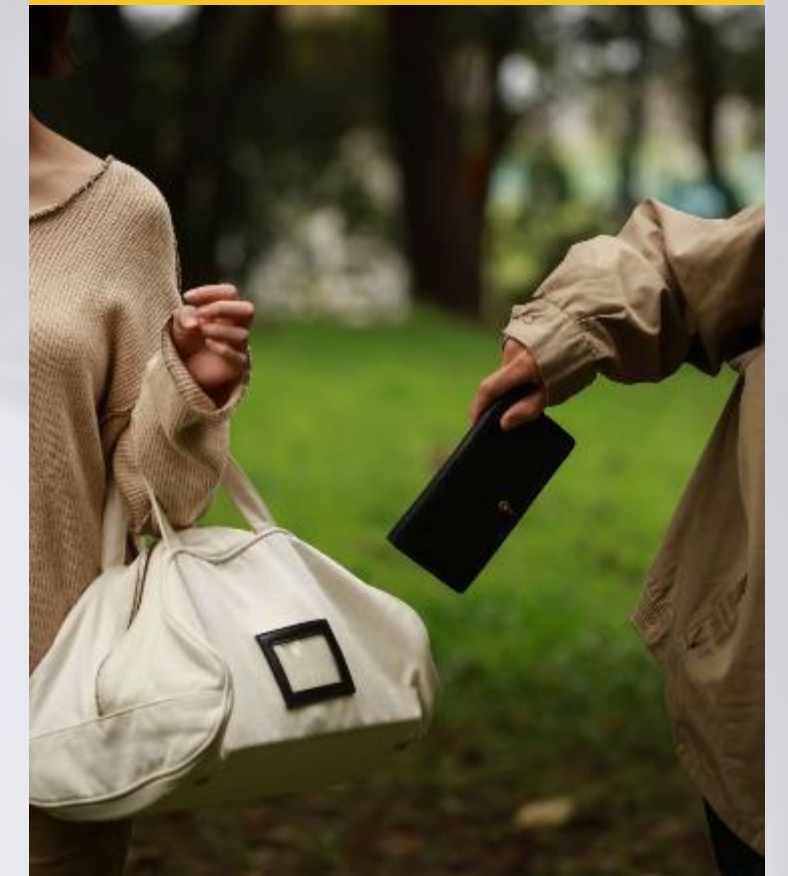

# Project Scala

## Pair of area men among nine charged in illegal gambling bust

Police say officers seized video gaming machines, illicit tobacco and alcohol, cash, cryptocurrency wallet, silver bars, coins and controlled substances

January 22, 2026 | Multiple locations including residences and gaming houses in Vaughn and Toronto, a Toronto Business, a storage locker, and two vehicles

- Local residents charged include:
  - Paul Lessis, 47, of Innisfil
  - Salvatore Blanda, 50, of Tottenham
- The accused face multiple charges, including:
  - Possession of property obtained by crime over \$5,000
  - Trafficking in proceeds of crime
  - Keeping a common gaming or betting house
  - Having money or property for betting or gaming
  - Possession for the purpose of trafficking
  - Possession of a controlled substance
  - Allowing a machine to be kept for gambling or betting



# Barrie man, ex-Toronto cop charged in gambling extortion probe

January 13, 2026 | Officers executed search warrant at a residence in Barrie; Identified as former Toronto Police officer | YRPS in partnership with SSPS

- As a result, **Thomas Phippard (Frank the Tank), 47, Toronto**, has been charged (Jan. 12) with further counts of:
  - Extortion (x3)
  - Uttering threats
- And **John Madeley, 55, Barrie** has been charged (Jan. 13) with:
  - Breach of trust
  - Unauthorized use of computer (x3)
  - Possession of firearm at unauthorized place
  - Possession of prohibited device (x2)
  - Possession of property obtained by crime under \$5,000



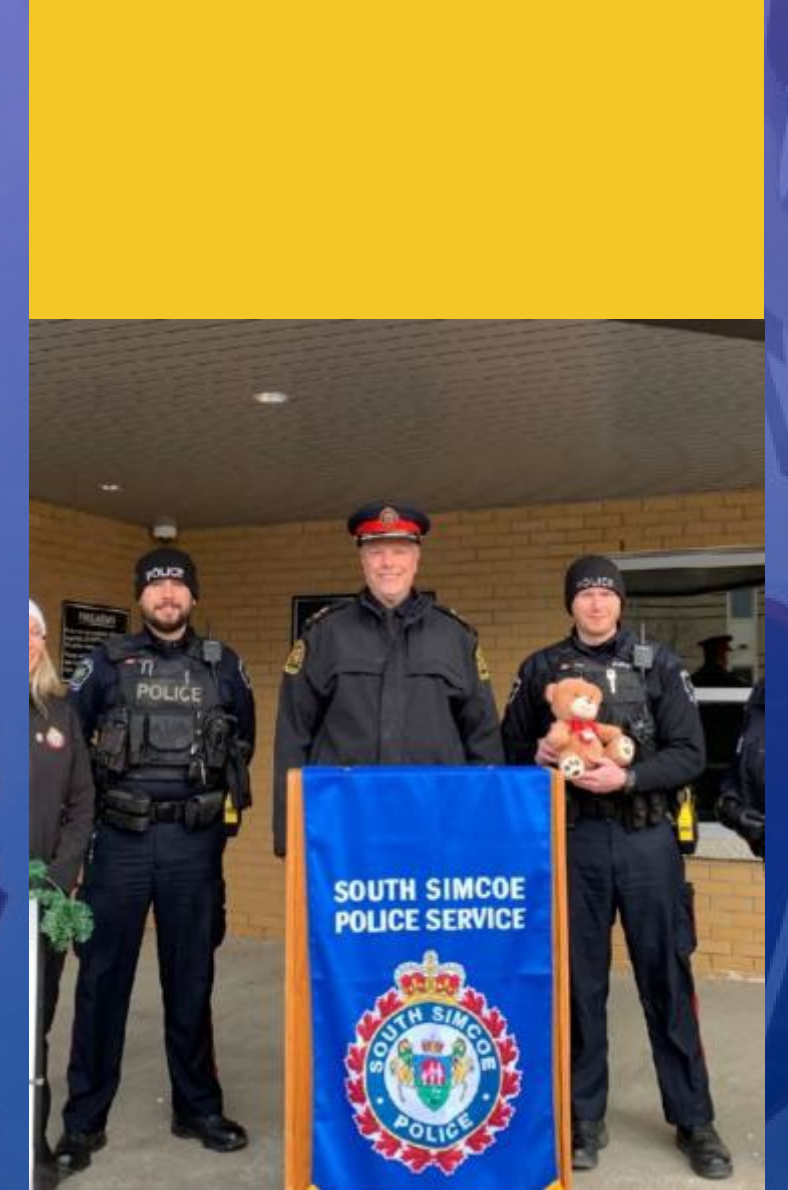

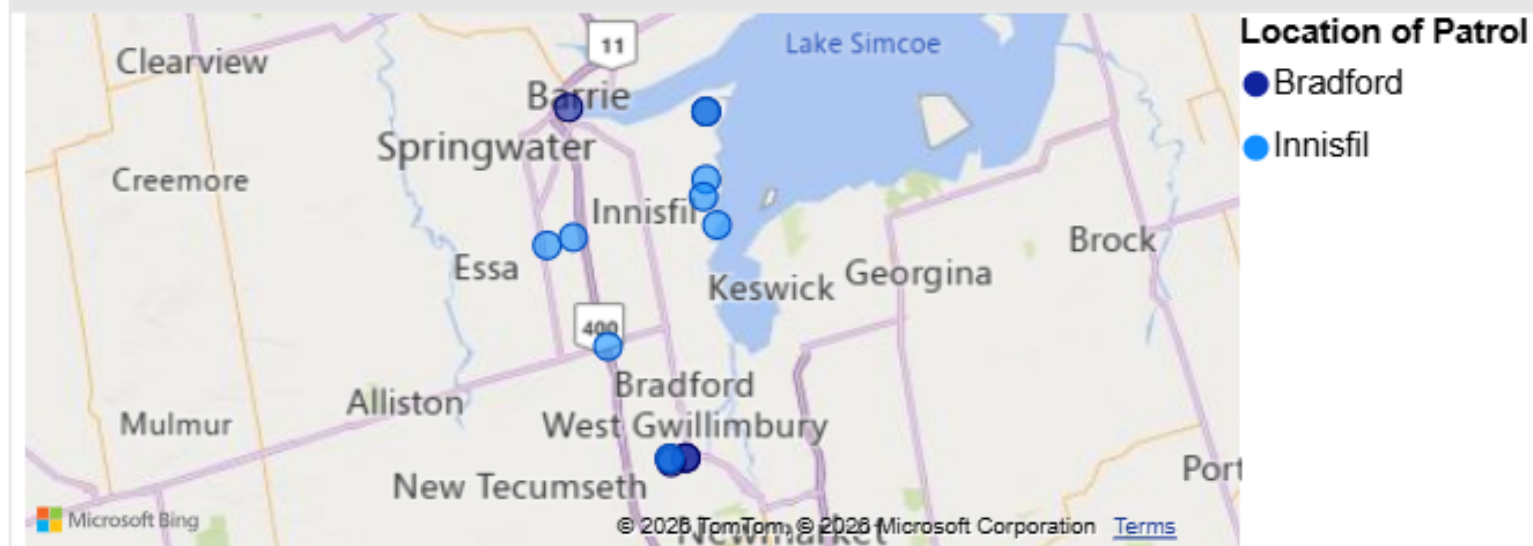
### NUMBER OF PATROLS IN INNISFIL VS BWG



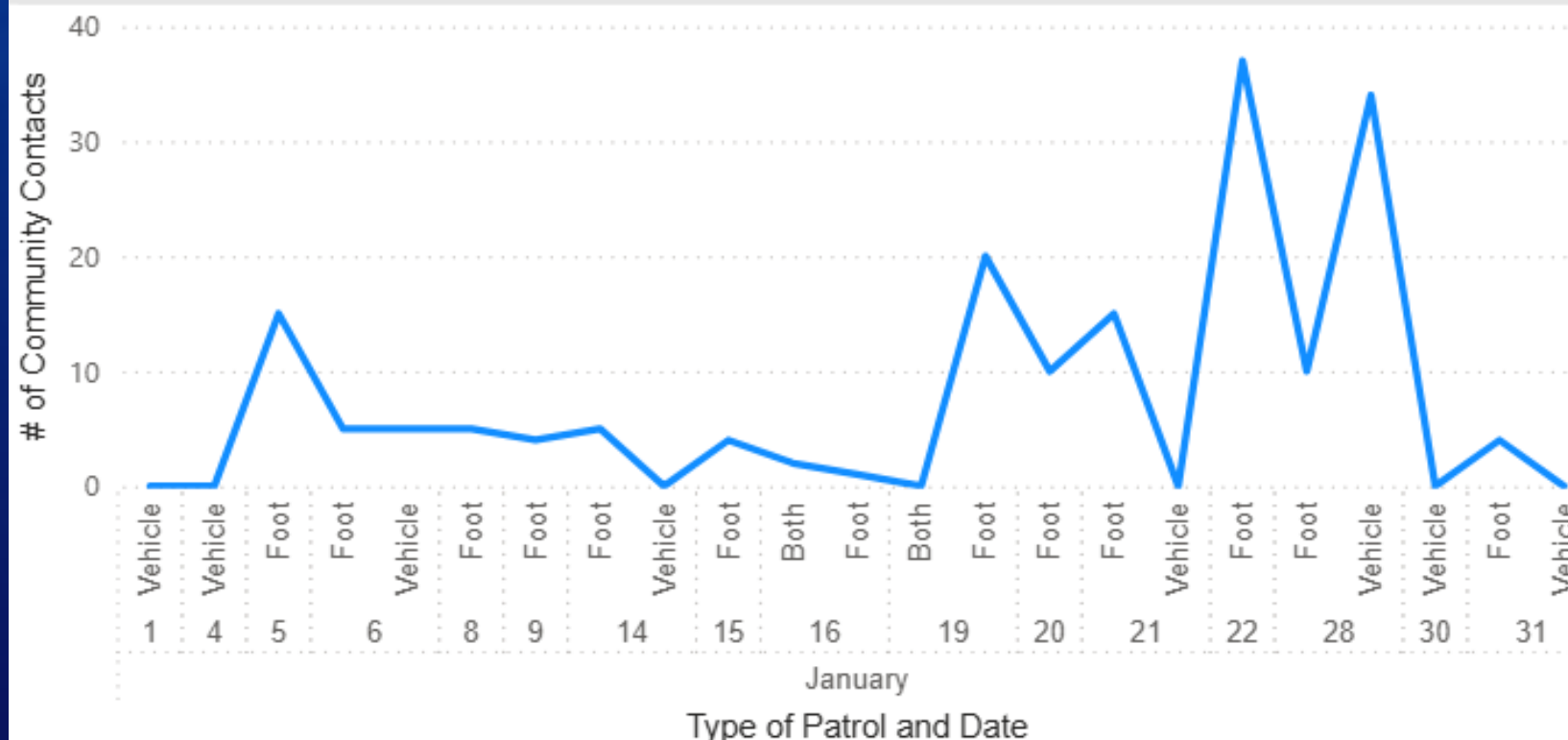
### TIME SPENT PATROLLING



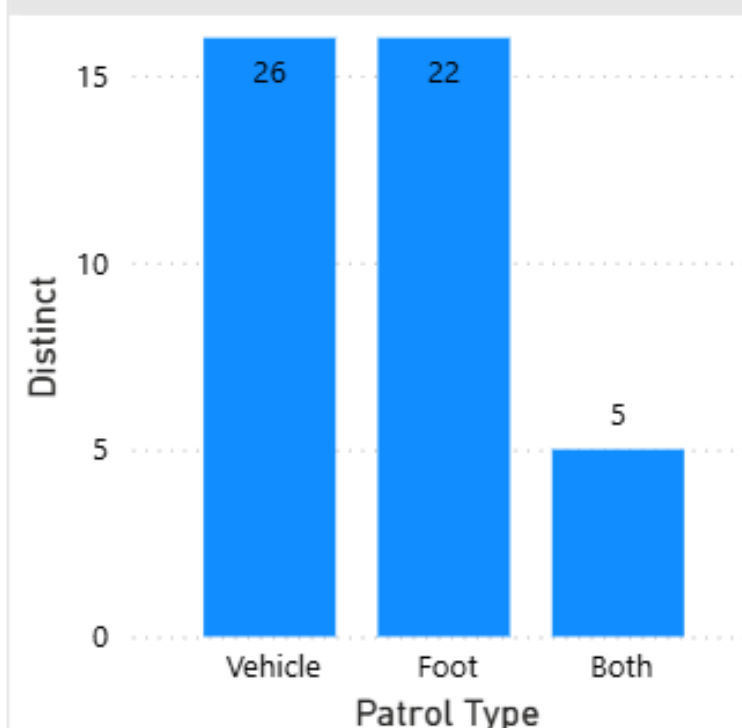
### COMMON LOCATIONS OF PATROL



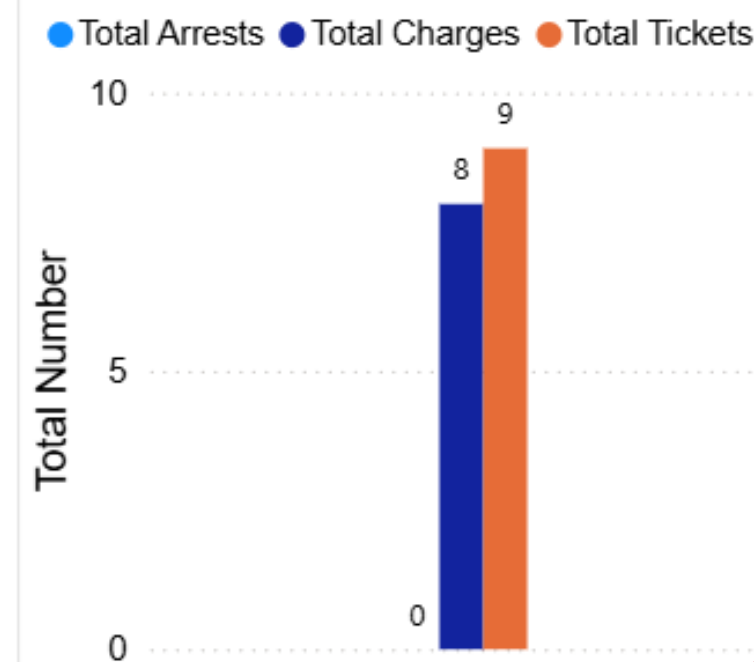
### # OF COMMUNITY CONTACTS OVER TIME

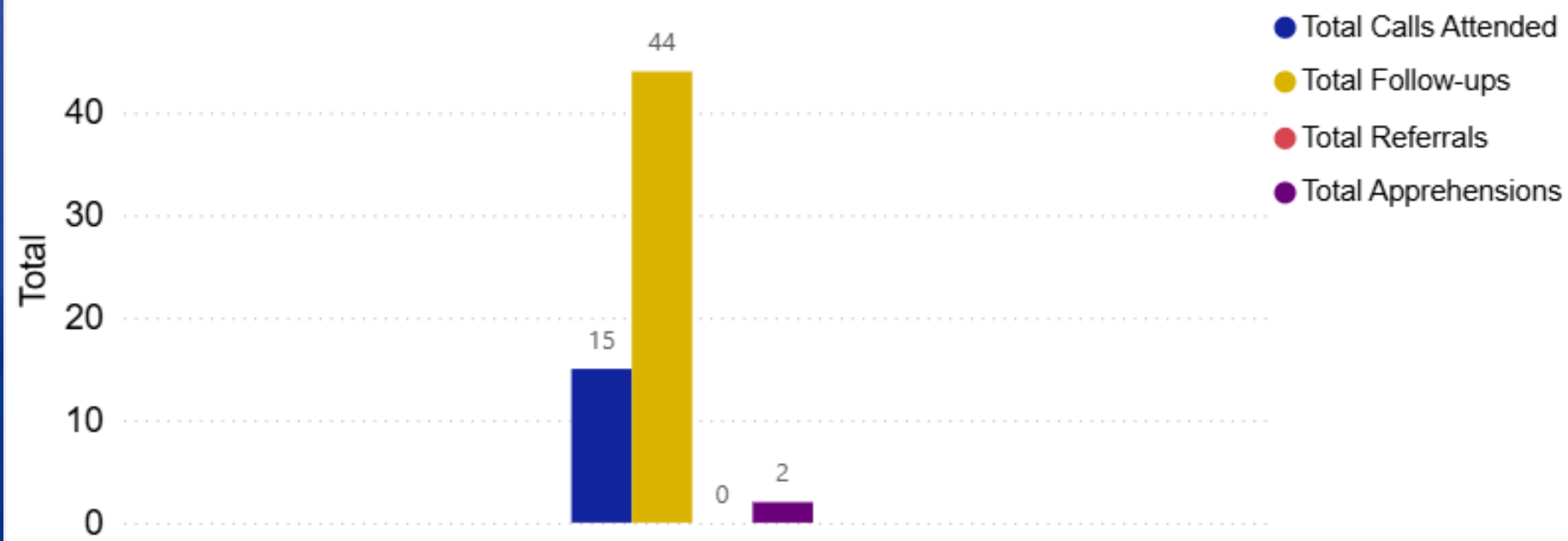

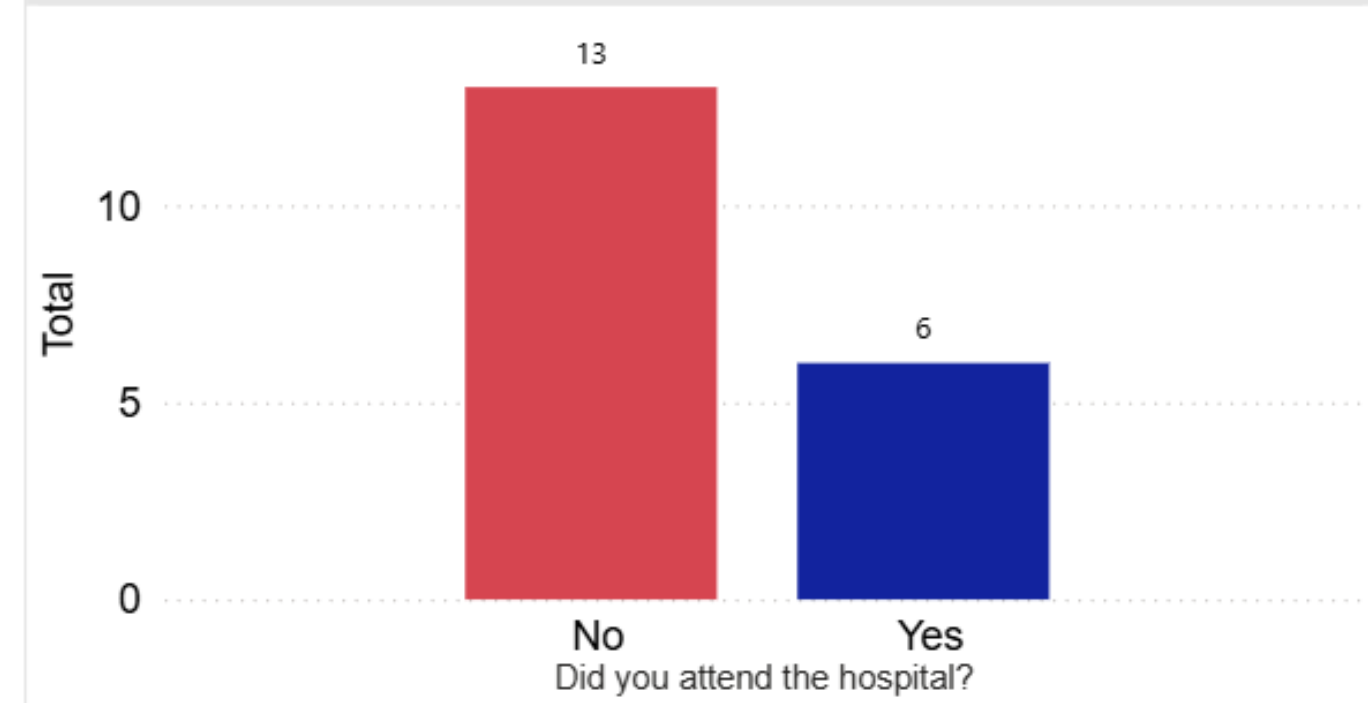

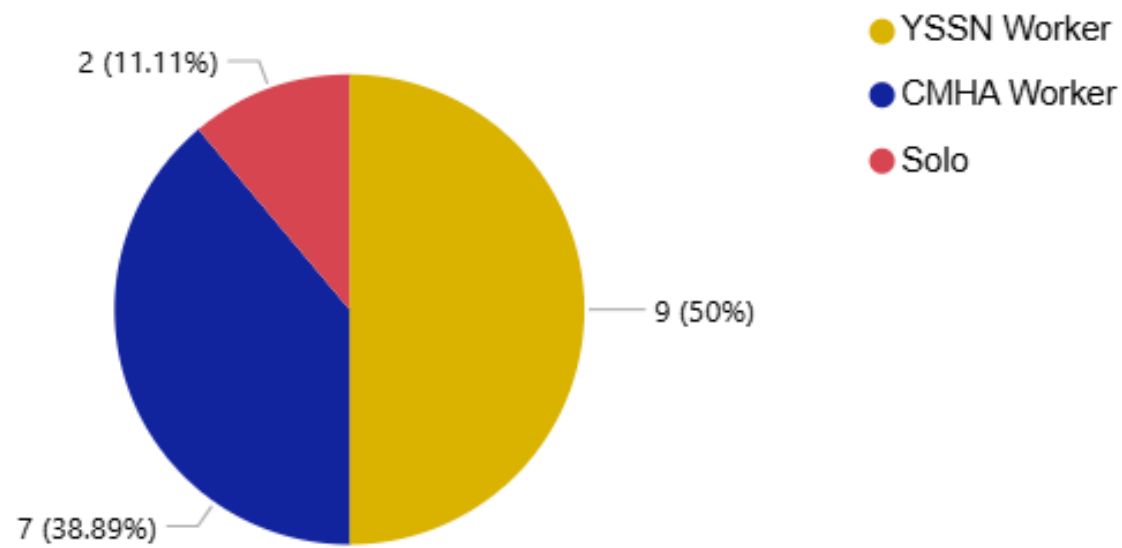

# South Simcoe Police's crisis response boosted with \$145k of provincial funding

January 30, 2026 | Mobile Crisis Response Team Enhancement Grant

- Ontario is investing \$145,000 (two years) in South Simcoe Police's crisis response.
- Breakdown: \$120,000 (MCRT) + \$25,000 (PSP mental-health supports).
- Intended impact: expanded coverage during peak crisis-call hours and support for MCRT (formerly COAST) responses.

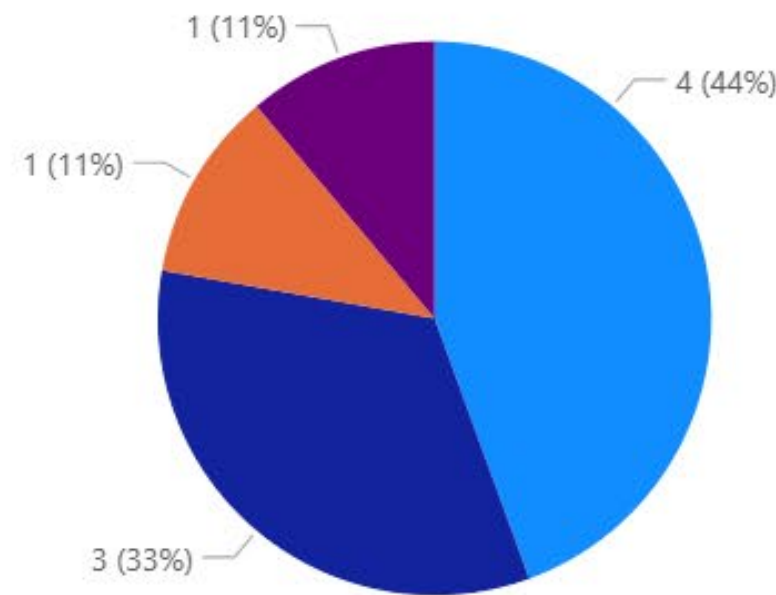

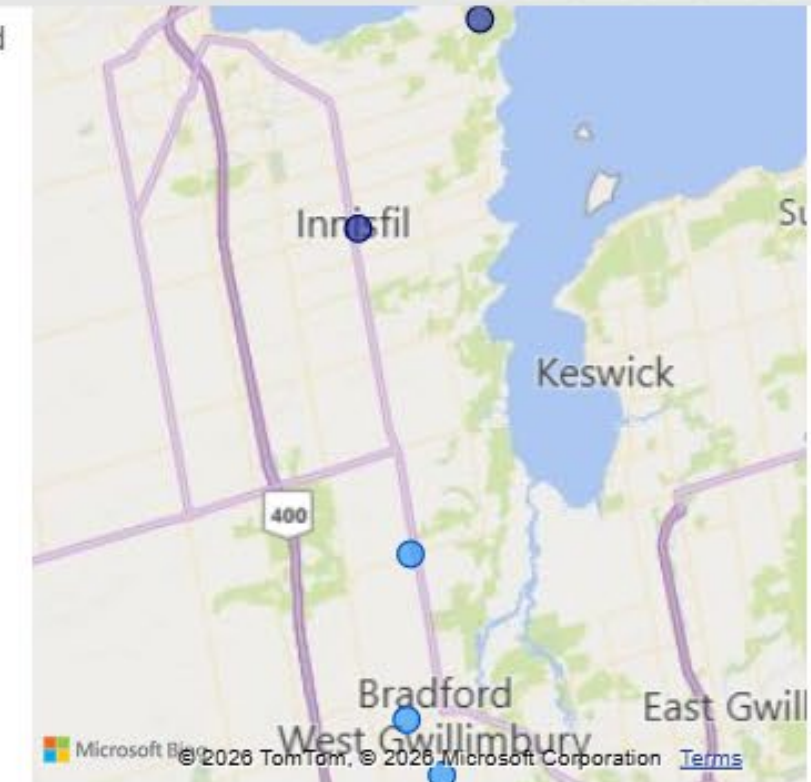

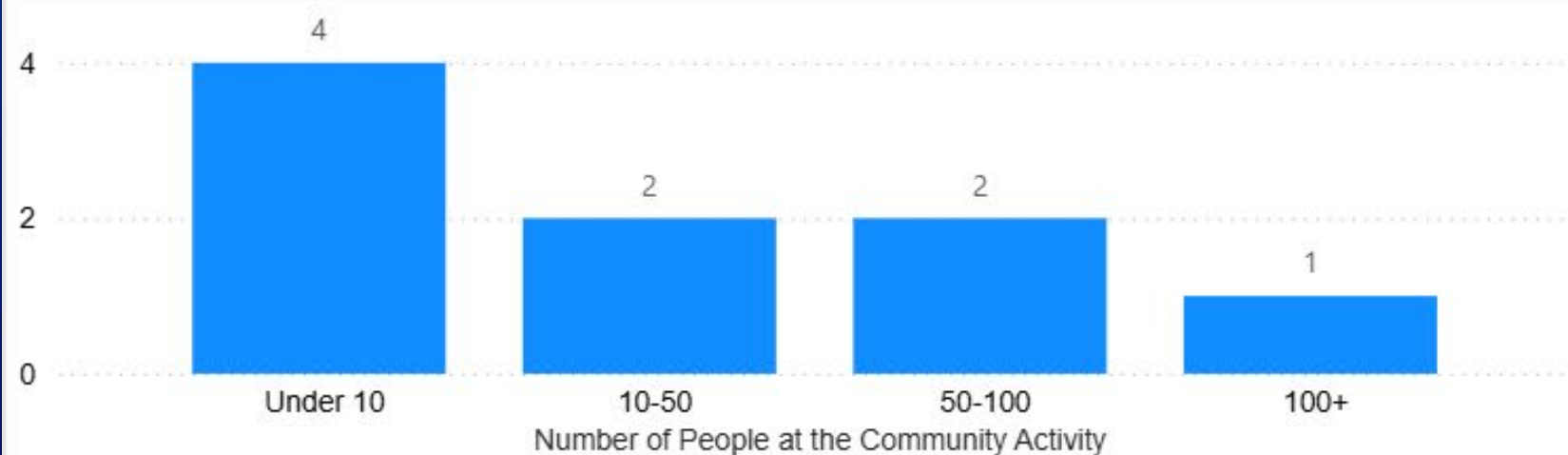


### LOCATION OF COMMUNITY ACTIVITIES

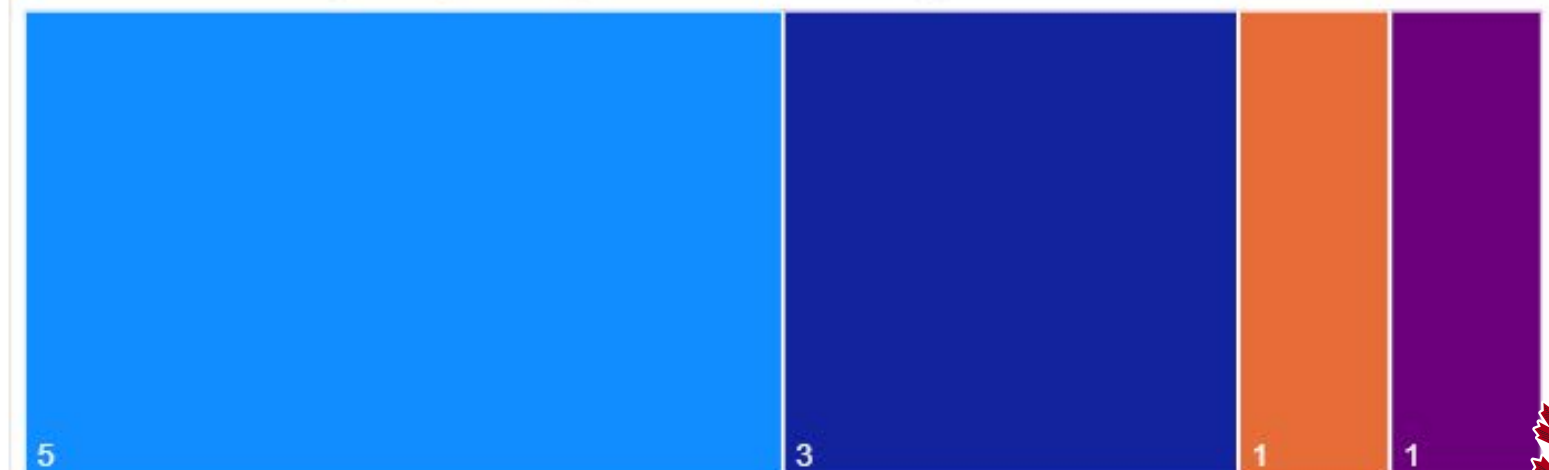


### NUMBER OF PEOPLE AT COMMUNITY ACTIVITY AND TOTAL ACTIVITIES ATTENDED

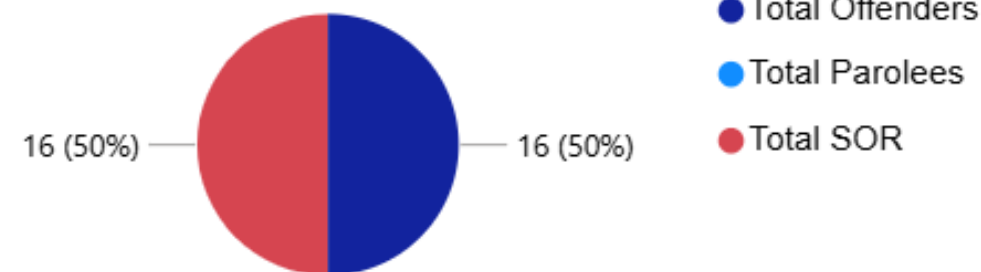

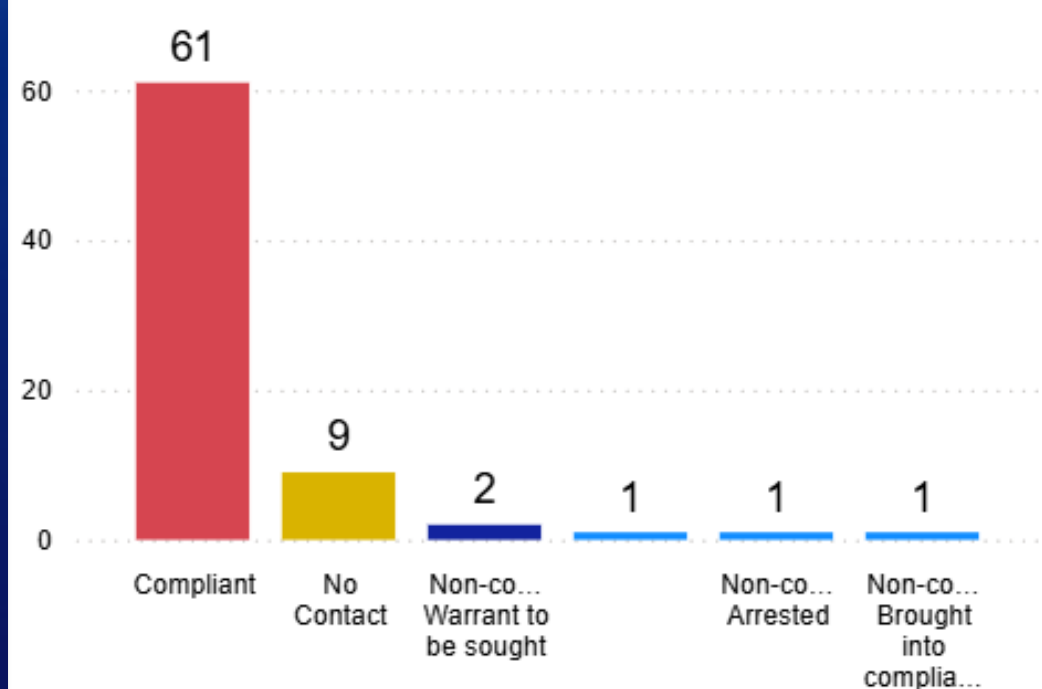

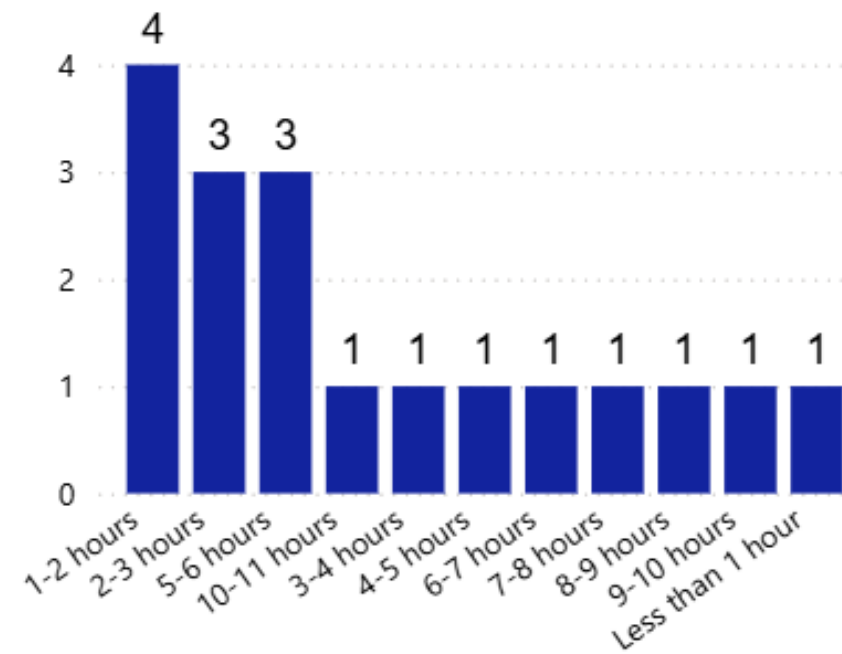
### TOTAL # OF CHARGES LAID DURING OFFENDER MANAGEMENT



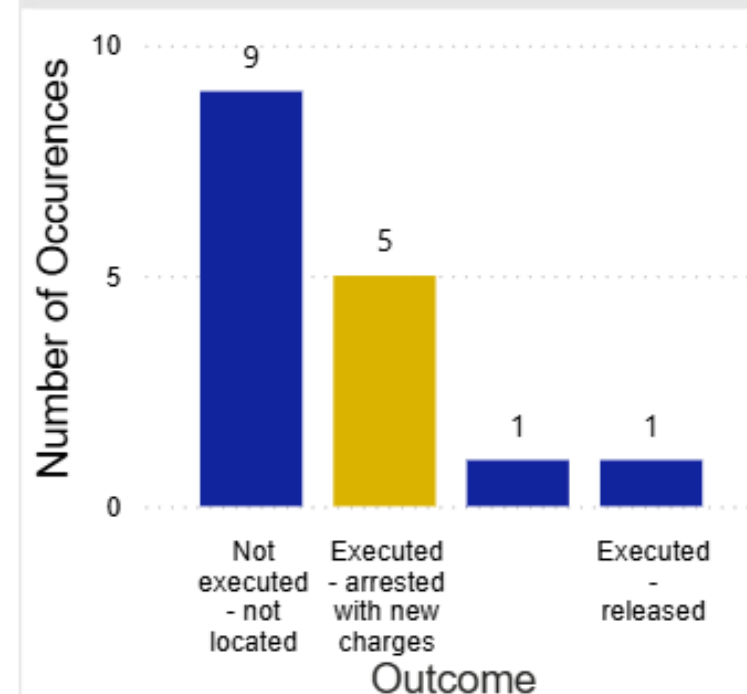
### OUTCOME OF COMPLIANCE CHECKS



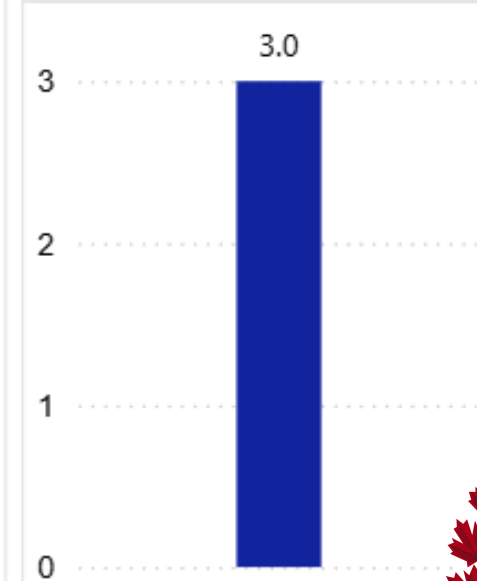

# Remotely Piloted Aircraft System (RPAS)



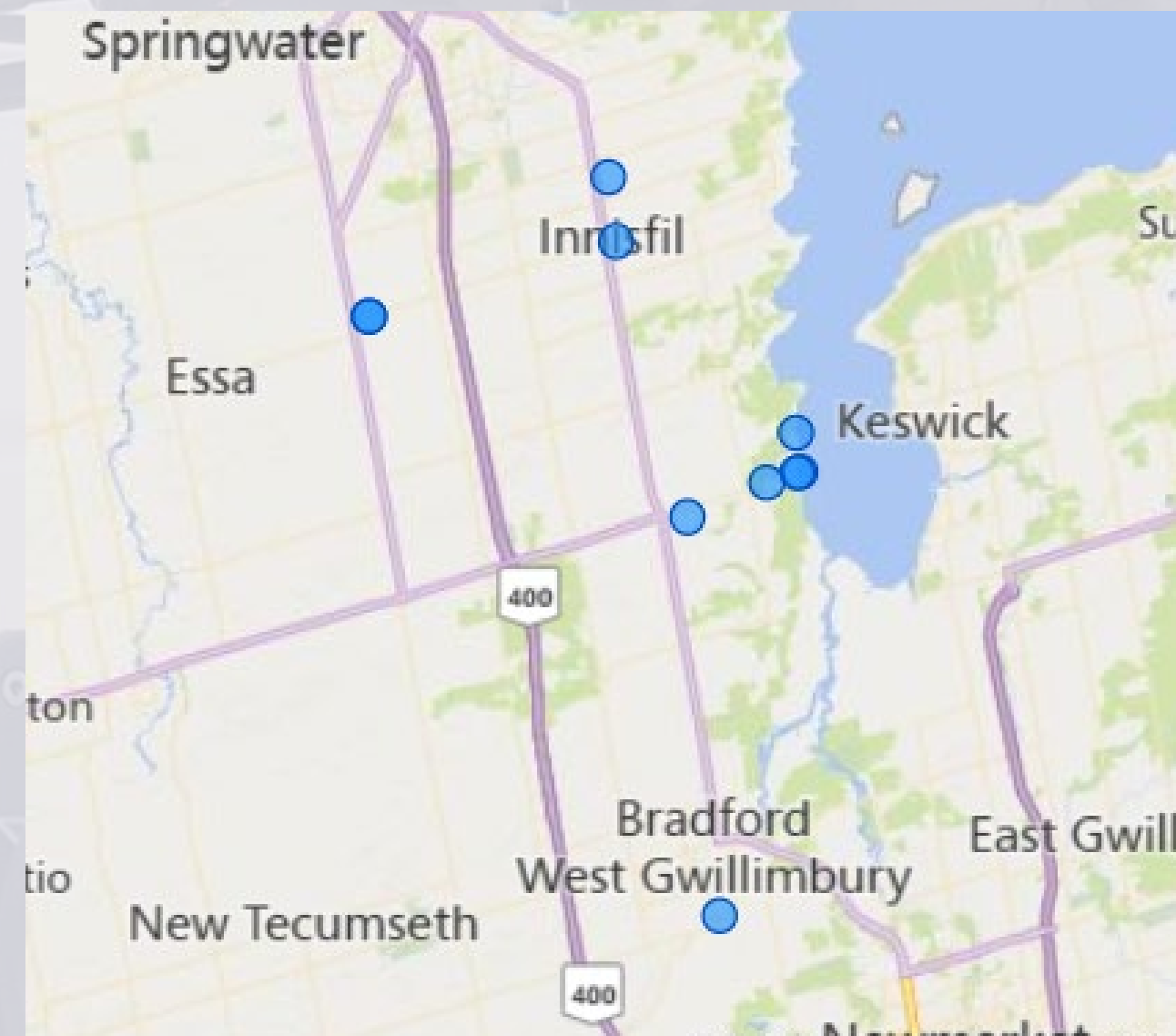
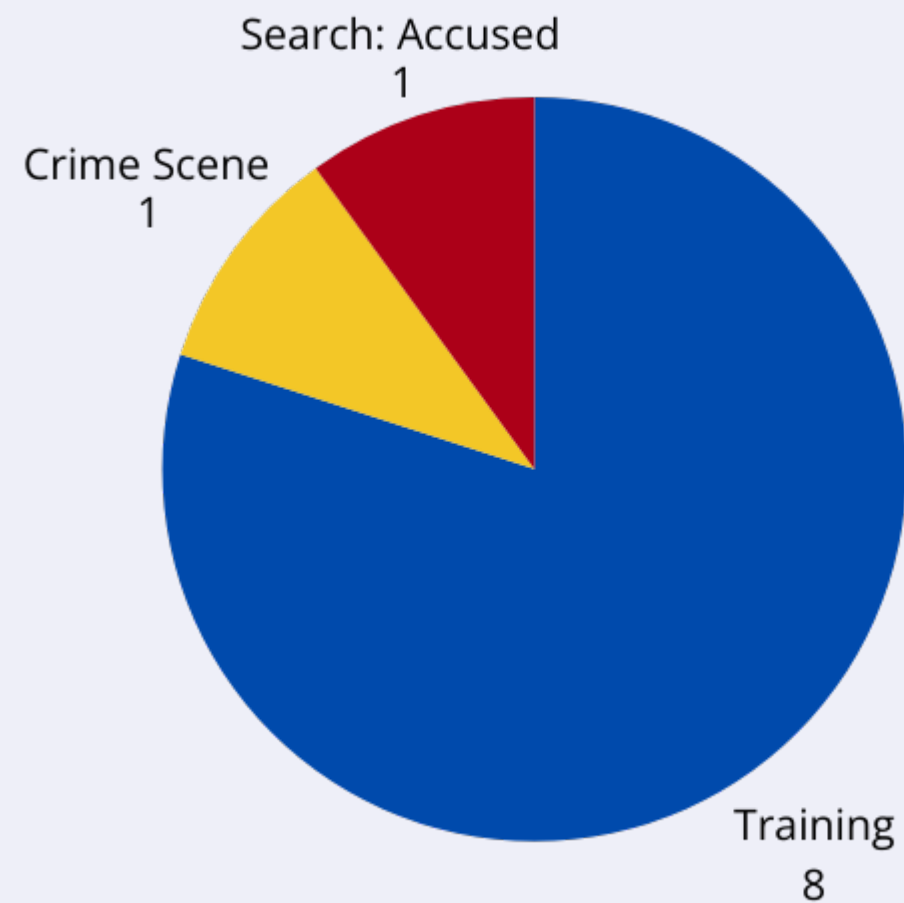

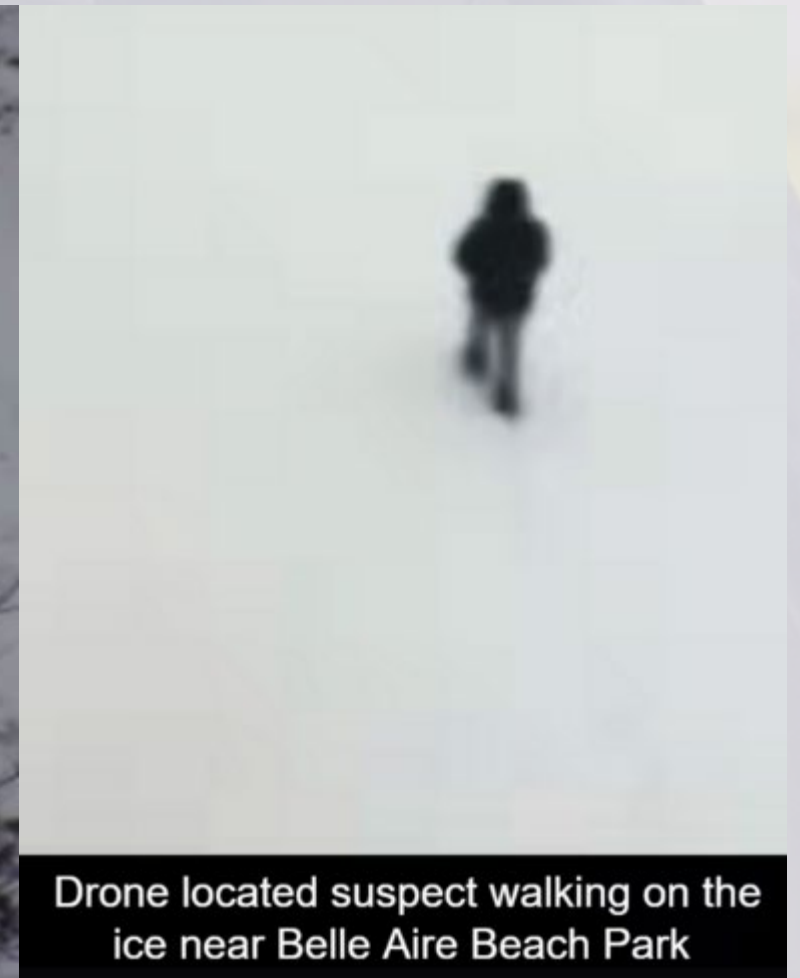
Map View of

# Drone aids SSP in nabbing suspect who ignored two attempted traffic stops

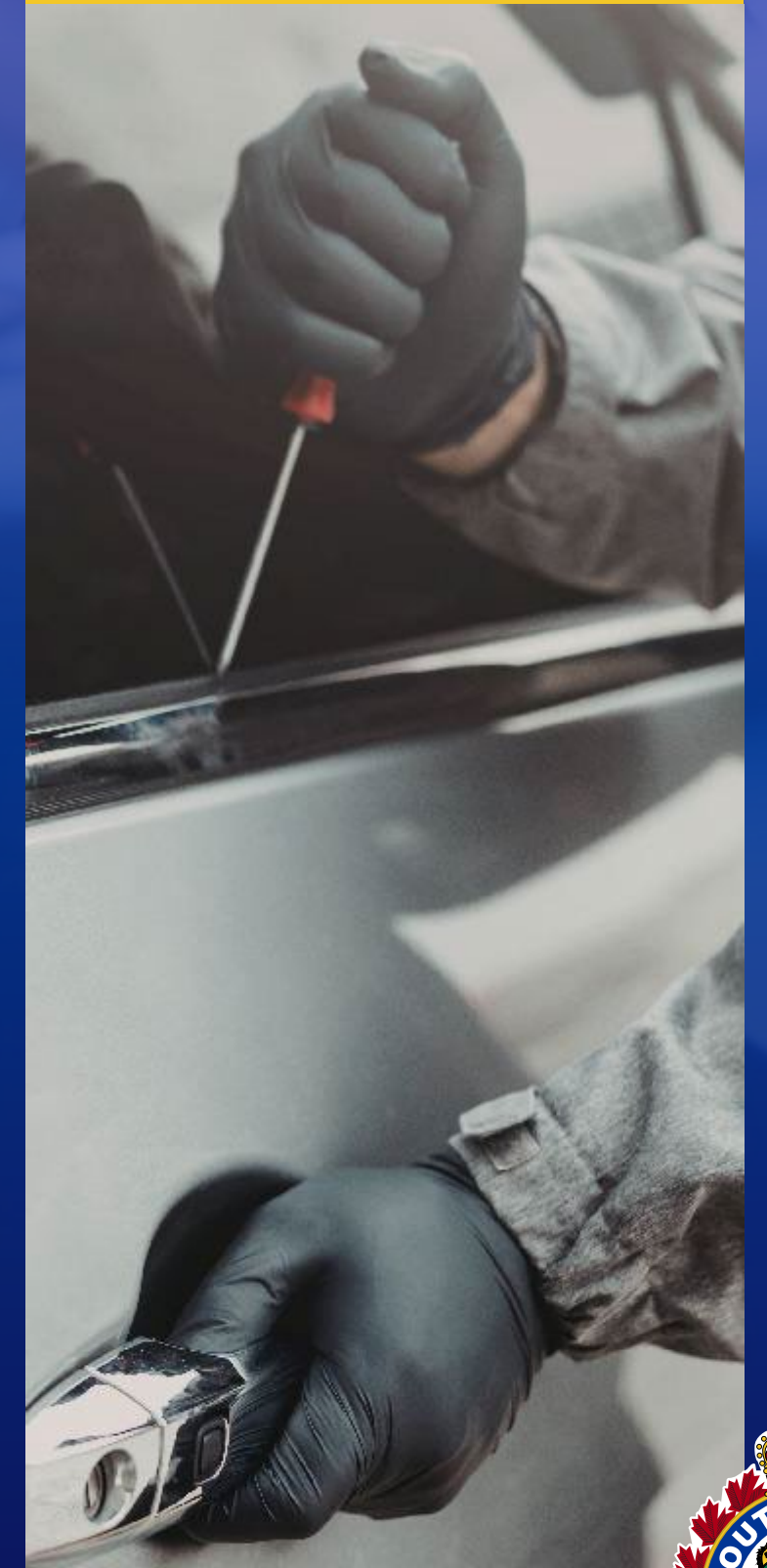
January 17, 2026 | 11:30AM | Innisfil Beach Road and 20th Sideroad,
