10.1 Community Safety and Well-Being Survey Report – Dr. Tori Semple and Amy Lei (moved from closed session of this meeting)

Dr. Semple shared the survey results received from our community. This is the first time we have completed this survey.

The survey was organized into 4 main sections with an executive summary. The main sections included respondent profile, engagement with SSPS, perceptions of SSPS and perceptions of safety. The last section is written for the members of the public explaining how we are using the findings. The findings from this survey, along with other community consultations we conducted were used to inform the development of our 2026-2029 Strategic Plan, which is a roadmap that lays out the SSPS' priorities for the next four years. Priority 4 of our Plan, Enhance Community Safety, Visibility, and Trust, was developed based on the feedback from community engagement and is our commitment to addressing the primary concerns of our communities.

The documents is 42 pages in length and Dr. Semple asked that everyone review it in full.

The Chair thanked Dr. Semple and Amy Lei for their presentation. He noted that the results will be posted on the SSPS website.

Mayor Dollin said that she liked item number 5. She feels everyone should be telling people what survey findings are being used for.

Acting Deputy Fernandes presented Board Members with the May 2026 Operations Dashboard outlining there were 3332 total occurrences for the month of May. 26 of those were reported online. The municipal divide was 1503 Bradford, 1771 Innisfil and 58 outside of our area.

Acting Chief Landry shared that the June 2026 capital report expenditures show that of the \$2.9 million budget the year-to-date spending totals \$917,810. This includes vehicle upfitting of \$546,000, connected constable cell phones and computers for vehicles \$61,000, NG911 updates 88,000.

He then reported on the operational spending. The grants and cost recovering are reported as \$145,000. During the operating year we look at grant funding as income as it is received. We have completed report back for several 2025/26 but have not yet received the funds. There are also 2026/27 grants that we have applied for and some have been approved for that we have not received installments. Salaries, overtime and benefits are 5% under budget year to date. But as we are aware that will change once we have a wage increase following collective bargaining. Our fuel, repair and maintenance are also under budget by approximately 1.7%. In our last category of other expenses, we are in line with all our budget lines except Human Resources. We are slightly over in the amount of \$870 which represents wellness activities which took place. Overall, looking at our budget of \$31 million our year-to-date expenditures are at \$14,124,035.

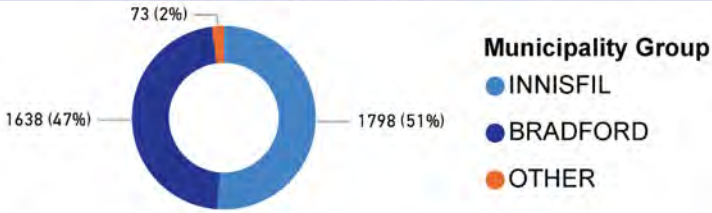

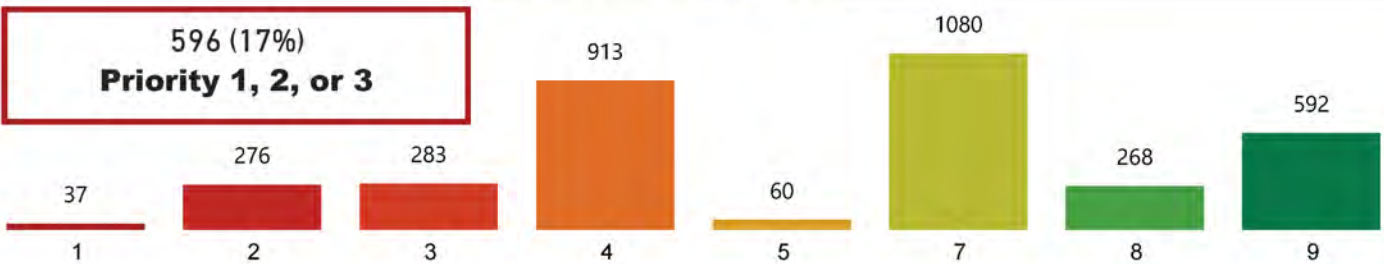

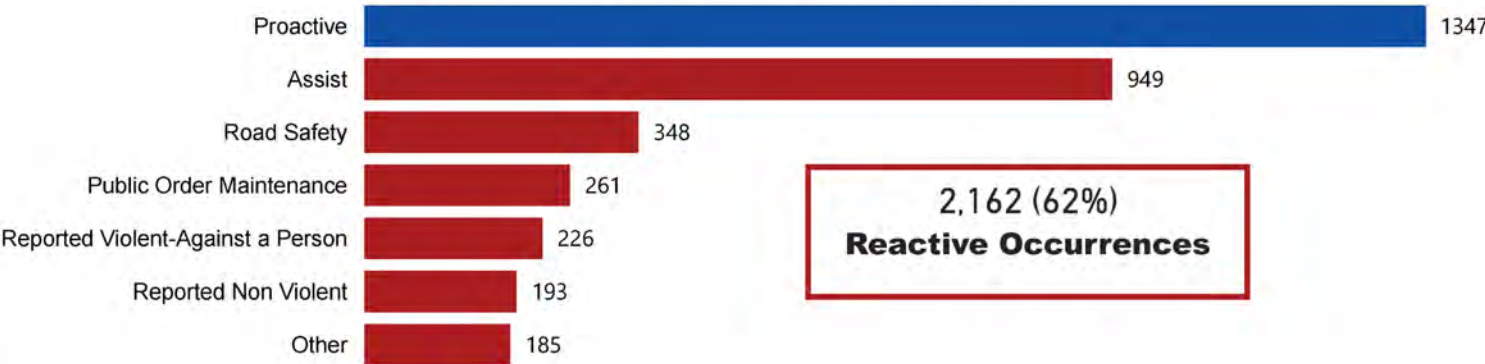

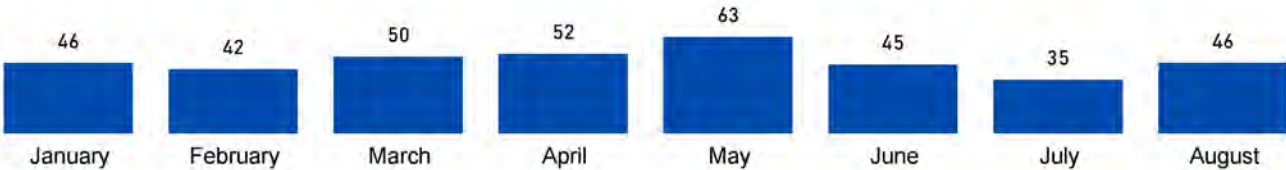

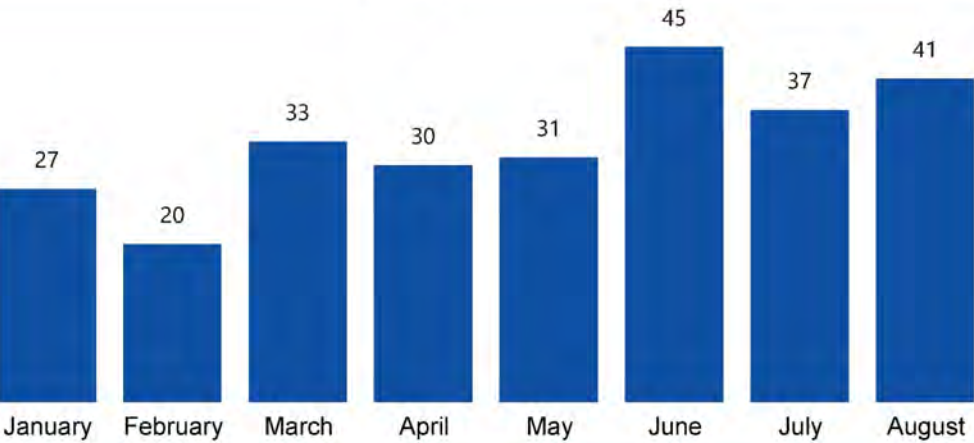

Count of Incidents Reported (August 2026)



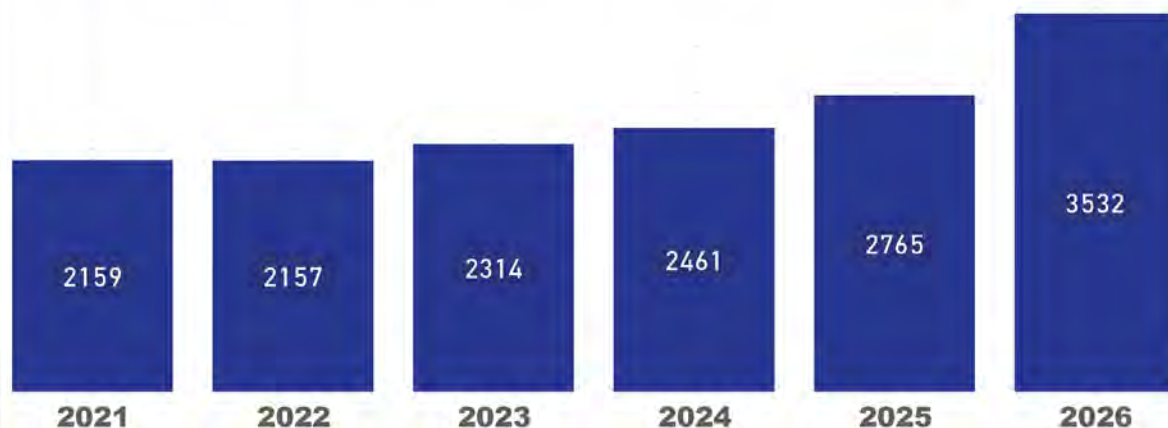

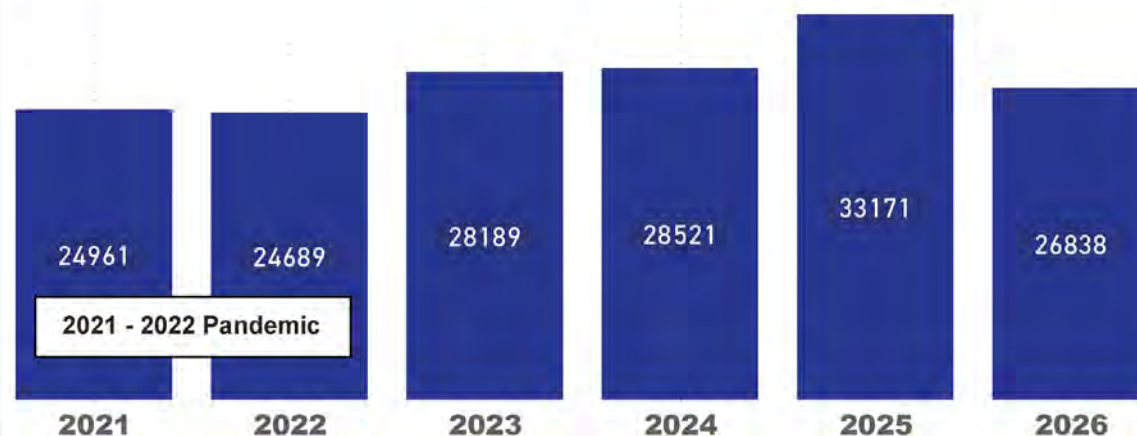

Barrie man faces attempted murder charges after hitting Bradford man with his car

August 6, 2026

- South Simcoe Police responded to a targeted incident in Bradford West Gwillimbury after a person was intentionally struck by a vehicle.
- The victim sustained non-life-threatening injuries, and police determined the victim and driver were known to each other.
- A **42-year-old Barrie man** was charged with:
 - **attempted murder**
 - **assault with a weapon**
 - **criminal harassment**
 - **uttering threats**
 - **and dangerous operation, and was held for a bail hearing.**
- Police confirmed the incident was isolated and there was no threat to public safety.

August 8, 2026

- South Simcoe Police responded to **two separate disturbances involving a 17-year-old youth operating an e-bike** in Bradford.

- The **17-year-old Bradford youth** was charged with 10 offences, including:

- **Both drivers received 30-day licence suspensions and 14-day vehicle impoundments.**





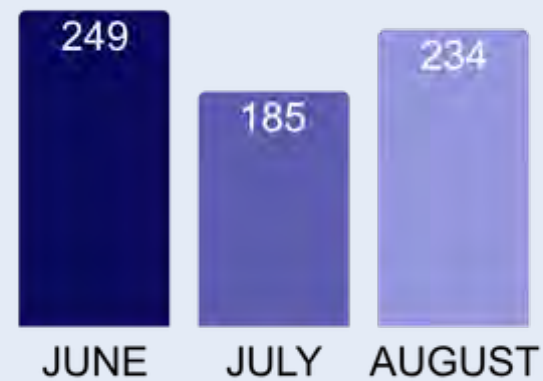

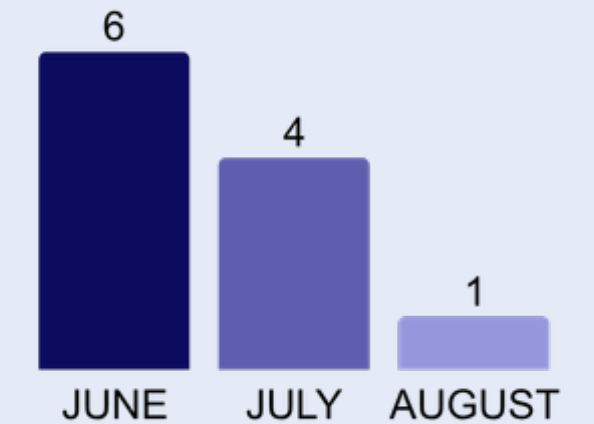

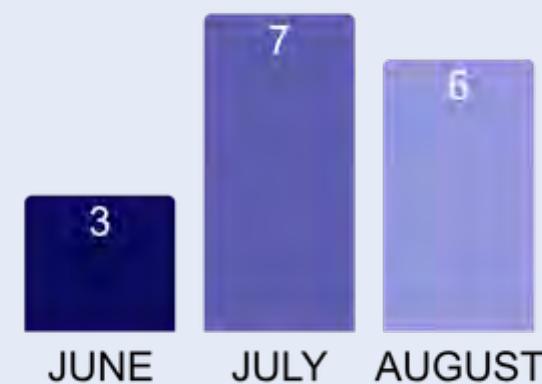

INTRODUCTION/BACKGROUND and UPDATE:

The South Simcoe Police Service Auxiliary Unit was formed in 1997 and has an authorized complement of thirty members. The Auxiliary Unit started 2026 with twenty-three active members. In May of 2026, 12 new officers were hired and added to the compliment, bringing our numbers to thirty-five active members. To date in 2026, 2 members have successfully gained employment with SSPS as Special Constables, 2 as front line officers and 1 has retired, reducing the compliment to 30. We currently have three members on leave, giving us a total of 27 active members.

The South Simcoe Police Auxiliary Unit continues to support frontline operations and enhance community policing efforts across our communities. The Auxiliary Unit remains committed to increasing visibility, assisting with public events, and contributing to public safety. This report outlines the activities, accomplishments, and operational support provided by the Unit during the first half of the year.

Sgt Jason VanderSar continues to be our direct supervisor, and Staff Sgt Willan has been appointed to oversee the Unit. A uniform liaison officer was approved to assist Sgt VanderSar with the Auxiliary Unit. PC Mathew Winch was chosen as liaison officer. PC Winch is currently a member of the Community Response Unit. He previously was an Auxiliary Officer with York Regional Police for 8 years and had obtained the rank of Auxiliary Sergeant.

- Assisted fleet with vehicle details, obtaining new vehicles and having them prepped for front line.

- Assisted with **IRD Training** for front line officers, enhancing readiness for crisis situations and improving community interaction skills.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Board receive this report pursuant to section 37(1)(i) of the Community Safety and Policing Act, 2019 (CSPA).

INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND:

This report provides cumulative and detailed information concerning public complaints made under Part X of the Community Safety and Policing Act (CSPA) from January 01 to June 30, 2026.

The *Community Safety and Policing Act* (CSPA) provides that a member of the public may make a complaint to the Law Enforcement Complaints Agency (LECA) about the conduct of a police officer or a Special Constable.

The LECA Director may decide not to deal with the complaint if in his/her opinion the complaint is frivolous, vexatious or made in bad faith, or if it is made more than six months after the facts on which it is based occurred.

Unless dismissed by the Complaints Director, the complaint may be referred to a specific person or body to be investigated, or it may be retained by LECA for investigation.

Under the CSPA, the Chief of Police no longer has responsibility for investigating or responding to complaints about the policies of, or services provided by South Simcoe Police. In accordance with section 107 of the CSPA, complaints about the adequacy and effectiveness of policing are investigated by the Inspector General, and complaints about the policies of the Board or the procedures established by the Chief of Police are now referred by the Inspector General directly to the Board for review and response.

The Community Safety and Policing Act (CSPA) sets out powers of the Chief of Police or Board to make an internal complaint. Such a complaint must be investigated and, unless it is determined to be unsubstantiated, the matter may be resolved informally or by hearing.

The Community Safety and Policing Act (CSPA) sets out the penalties that may be imposed and actions that may be taken if the misconduct is proven on clear and convincing evidence, and the decision of the Chief of Police or Board may be appealed to the Ontario Police Adjudication and Arbitration Commission (OPAC).

The CSPA mandates that police chiefs must submit semi-annual reports to their respective Police Services Boards detailing all public complaints received through the LECA, including the status of investigations and any disciplinary actions taken.

We continue to participate in ongoing programs with LECA, such as the Early Resolution and Informal Resolution process. These programs assist in the collaborative resolution of complaints at an early stage to promote understanding between complainants and police officers as opposed to a more formal investigation and adversarial process for minor complaint issues. The Early Resolution process occurs prior to a complaint being screened in by LECA for investigation, while the Informal Resolution process is similar, but occurs after a complaint has been screened in.

For the first half of 2026 (January to June), there were a total of fifteen (15) complaints made to LECA. Out of the fifteen (15) complaints, ten (10) of them were screened out and not accepted by LECA as they were deemed to be not in the public interest, or the complaint was deemed to be frivolous, vexatious or made in bad faith (in accordance with section 158 of the CSPA). For the remaining five (5) complaints; two (2) were resolved utilizing the informal resolution process, and the remaining three (3) were investigated. All three investigations resulted in the allegations being unsubstantiated.

*Formal discipline is conducted by way of a disciplinary hearing (OPAAC) if the appropriate penalty could be demotion or dismissal. Informal discipline is conducted internally by the Chief without a hearing, and can include measures such as documentation, training, counselling, forfeiture of hours/days, or unpaid suspension.

Special Investigation Unit Investigations (SIU)

The SIU is a civilian law enforcement agency, independent of the police, that conducts criminal investigations into circumstances involving police and civilians that have resulted in serious injury, death or allegations of sexual assault.

In the course of its investigations, the SIU gathers and assesses evidence, and the Director of the SIU decides whether or not the evidence leads to the reasonable belief that a criminal offence has been committed.

If the Director forms such a belief, she or he shall lay a criminal charge against the officer(s), and that charge will then be prosecuted by the Crown Attorney. If the Director does not form such a belief, she or he cannot lay a criminal charge against the officer(s).
